NOTICE OF NEXUS COMMUNICATIONS, INC. WITHDRAWING PETITION FOR EXEMPTION FROM THE YEARLY CUSTOMER AUDIT REQUIREMENT

Nexus Communications, Inc. ("Nexus"), by counsel, hereby withdraws its petition for an exemption from the generally-applicable requirement that all Eligible Telecommunications Carriers ("ETCs") perform an annual audit of all customers receiving Lifeline benefits, as set forth in *An Inquiry into Universal Service and Funding Issues*, Administrative Case No. 360 (KPSC, Order dated May 24, 2007) ("USF Order"). Due to differences between Nexus's business model and those of other carriers subject to the USF Order, the annual audit requirement, without modification, will impose a greater burden on Nexus than on other ETCs. However, Nexus desires to simplify and expedite this proceeding, and therefore states that it will comply fully with the customer audit requirements of the USF Order if its petition in this case is granted.
