#### APPLICATION

This Application of the Breathitt County Water District (the "Applicant") respectfully shows:

- 1. That the Applicant is a water district of Breathitt County, Kentucky, created and existing under and by virtue of Chapter 74 of the Kentucky Revised Statues.
  - 2. That the post office address of the Applicant is:

Breathitt County Water District c/o Mr. John L. Smith, Chairman 1137 Main Street Jackson, Kentucky 41339

- 3. That the Applicant, pursuant to the provisions of KRS 278.020 and 278.023, seeks (i) a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, permitting the Applicant to construct a waterworks construction project, consisting of extensions, additions, and improvements (the "Project") to the existing waterworks system of the Applicant; and (ii) approval of the proposed plan of financing said Project.
- 4. That the proposed project consists of the installation of approximately 20 miles of 2, 4, 6 and 8 inch waterline and a booster pumping station, and the construction of two ground water storage tanks.
- 5. That the Applicant proposes to finance the construction of the Project through (i) issuance of \$350,000 of its Waterworks Revenue Bonds, (ii) a U.S. Department of Agriculture, acting through Rural Development ("RD") grant in the amount of \$250,000, (iii) an Appalachian Regional Commission ("ARC") grant in the amount of \$500,000, and (iv) a Community

Development Block Grant ("CDBG") in the amount of \$862,800. The Applicant has a commitment from RD to purchase said \$350,000 of bonds maturing over a 40-year period, at an interest rate of not exceeding 2.75% per annum, as set out in the RD Letter of Conditions filed herewith as an Exhibit.

- 6. That the Applicant does not contemplate having the Project constructed with any deviation from minimum construction standards of this Public Service Commission.
- 7. That the Applicant files herewith the following Exhibits pursuant to 807 KAR 5:069 in support of this Application:
  - A. Copy of RD Letter of Conditions, as amended.
  - B. Copy of RD Letter of Concurrence in Bid Award.
  - C. Copy of Preliminary and Final Engineering Reports.
  - D. Certified statement from the Chairman of the Applicant, based upon statements of the Engineers for the Applicant, concerning the following:
    - (1) The proposed plans and specifications for the Project have been designed to meet the minimum construction and operating requirements set out in 807 KAR 5:066, Section 4(3) and (4); Section 5(1); Sections 6 and 7; Section 8(1) through (3); Section 9(1) and Section 10;
    - (2) All other state approvals or permits have already been obtained;
    - (3) The existing rates of the Applicant shall produce the total revenue requirements set out in the engineering reports; and
    - (4) Setting out the dates when it is anticipated that construction will begin and end.
- 8. That the foregoing constitutes the documents necessary to obtain the approval of the Public Service Commission in accordance with Section 278.023 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes and in accordance with the "Filing Requirements" specified in 807 KAR 5:069, Section 1.

WHEREFORE, the Applicant, the Breathitt County Water District, asks that the Public Service Commission of the Commonwealth of Kentucky grant to the Applicant the following:

- a. A Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity permitting the Applicant to construct a waterworks project consisting of extensions, additions, and improvements to the existing waterworks system of the Applicant.
- b. An Order approving the financing arrangements made by the Applicant, viz., the issuance of \$350,000 of Breathitt County Water District Waterworks Revenue Bonds at an interest rate of not exceeding 2.75% per annum; an RD grant in the amount of \$250,000; an ARC grant in the amount of \$500,000; and a CDBG grant in the amount of \$862,800.

This letter establishes conditions which must be understood and agreed to by you before further consideration may be given to the application. The loan and grant will be administered on behalf of the Rural Utilities Service (RUS) by the State and Area office staff of USDA Rural Development. Any changes in project cost, source of funds, scope of services or any other significant changes in the project or applicant must be reported to and approved by USDA Rural Development, by written amendment to this letter. Any changes not approved by Rural Development shall be cause for discontinuing processing of the application. It should also be understood that Rural Development is under no obligation to provide additional funds to meet an overrun in construction costs.

This letter is not to be considered as loan and grant approval or as a representation as to the availability of funds. The docket may be completed on the basis of a RUS loan not to exceed \$350,000, a RUS grant not to exceed \$250,000, and an Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) grant in the amount of \$500,000.

If Rural Development makes the loan, the interest rate will be the lower of the rate in effect at the time of loan approval or the rate in effect at the time of loan closing, unless the applicant otherwise chooses. The loan will be considered approved on the date a signed copy of Form RD 1940-1, "Request for Obligation of Funds," is mailed to you.

Please complete and return the attached Form RD 1942-46, "Letter of Intent to Meet Conditions," if you desire that further consideration be given to your application.

The "Letter of Intent to Meet Conditions" must be executed within three weeks from the date of this letter or it becomes invalid unless a time extension is granted by Rural Development.

If the conditions set forth in this letter are not met within 240 days from the date hereof, Rural Development reserves the right to discontinue the processing of the application.

In signing Form RD 1942-46, "Letter of Intent to Meet Conditions," you are agreeing to complete the following as expeditiously as possible:

#### 1. Number of Users and Their Contribution:

There shall be 884 water users, of which 420 are existing users, 414 are users from projects under construction, and 50 are new users. The Area Director will review and authenticate the number of users <u>prior to advertising for construction bids</u>.

#### 1. Grant Agreement:

Attached is a copy of RUS Bulletin 1780-12, "Water and Waste System Grant Agreement," for your review. You will be required to execute a completed form at the time of grant closing.

#### 3. Drug-Free Work Place:

Prior to grant closing, the District will be required to execute Form AD-1049, "Certification Regarding Drug-Free Workplace Requirements (Grants) Alternative I - For Grantees Other Than Individuals."

#### 4. Repayment Period:

The loan will be scheduled for repayment over a period not to exceed 40 years from the date of the Bond. Principal payment will not be deferred for a period in excess of two years from the date of the Bond. Payments will be in accordance with applicable KRS, which requires interest to be paid semi-annually (January 1st and July 1st) and principal will be due on or before the first of January. Rural Development may require the District to adopt a supplemental payment agreement providing for monthly payments of principal and interest so long as the bond is held or insured by RUS. Monthly payments will be approximate amortized installments.

#### 5. Recommended Repayment Method:

Payments on this loan shall be made using the Preauthorized Debit (PAD) payment method. This procedure eliminates the need for paper checks and ensures timely receipt of RD loan payments. To initiate PAD payments, Form SF 5510, "Authorization Agreement for Preauthorized Payments," should be signed by the District to authorize the electronic withdrawal of funds from your designated bank account on the exact installment payment due date. The Area Director will furnish the necessary forms and further guidance on the PAD procedure.

#### 6. Reserve Accounts:

Reserves must be properly budgeted to maintain the financial viability of any operation. Reserves are important to fund unanticipated emergency maintenance, pay for repairs, and assist with debt service should the need arise.

The District will be required to deposit \$125 per month into a "Funded Depreciation Reserve Account" until the account reaches \$15,000. The deposits are to be resumed any time the account falls below the \$15,000.

The required monthly deposits to the Reserve Account and required Reserve Account levels are in addition to the requirements of the District's prior bond resolutions.

The monthly deposits to the Reserve Account are required to commence with the first month of the first full fiscal year after the facility becomes operational.

The District also needs to fund an account for short-lived assets by depositing a sum of \$1,600 monthly into the account. The funds in the short-lived asset account may be used by the District as needed to replace or add short-lived assets in the District's water system.

#### 7. <u>Security Requirements</u>:

A pledge of gross water revenue will be provided in the Bond Resolution. Bonds shall rank on a parity with existing bonds, if possible.

If this is not possible, the bond will be subordinate and junior to the existing bonds, in which case the District will be required to abrogate its right to issue additional bonds ranking on a parity with the existing bonds, so long as any unpaid indebtedness remains on this bond issue.

#### 8. <u>Land Rights and Real Property</u>:

The District will be required to furnish satisfactory title, easements, etc., necessary to install, maintain and operate the facility to serve the intended users. The pipelines will be on private rights-of-way where feasible. Easements and options are to be secured prior to advertising for construction bids.

#### 9. <u>Organization</u>:

The District will be legally organized under applicable KRS which will permit them to perform this service, borrow and repay money.

#### 10. Business Operations:

The District will be required to operate the system under a well-established set of resolutions, rules and regulations. A budget must be established annually and adopted by the District after review by Rural Development. At no later than loan pre-closing, the District will be required to furnish a prior approved management plan to include, as a minimum, provisions for management, maintenance, meter reading, miscellaneous services, billing, collecting, delayed payment penalties, disconnect/reconnect fees, bookkeeping, making and delivering required reports and audits.

#### 11. Accounts, Records and Audits:

The District will be required to maintain adequate records and accounts and submit annual budgets and year-end reports (annual audits) /statistical and financial reports, quarterly and annually, in accordance with subsection 1780.47 of RUS Instruction 1780.

The enclosed audit booklet will be used as a guide for preparation of audits. The District shall be required to submit a copy of its audit agreement for review and concurrence by Rural Development prior to pre-closing the loan.

The District shall obtain the assistance of its accountant to establish the District's accounting system. Rural Development review of the accounting system is required.

#### 12. Accomplish Audits for Years in Which Federal Financial Assistance is Received:

The District will accomplish audits in accordance with OMB Circular A-133, during the years in which federal funds are received. The District will provide copies of the audits to the Area Office and the appropriate Federal cognizant agency as designated by OMB Circular A-133.

#### 13. Insurance and Bonding:

The following insurance and bonding will be required:

- A. Adequate Liability and Property Damage Insurance including vehicular coverage, if applicable, must be obtained and maintained by the District. The District should obtain amounts of coverage as recommended by its attorney, consulting engineer and/or insurance provider.
- B. Worker's Compensation The District will carry worker's compensation insurance for employees in accordance with applicable state laws.
- C. Fidelity Bond The District will provide Fidelity Bond Coverage for all persons who have access to funds. Coverage may be provided either for all individual positions or persons, or through "blanket" coverage providing protection for all appropriate employees and/or officials. The amount of coverage required for all RUS loans is \$15,000.
- D. Real Property Insurance The District will obtain and maintain adequate fire and extended coverage on all structures including major items of equipment or machinery located in the structures. The amounts of coverage should be based on recommendations obtained by the District from its attorney, consulting engineer and/or insurance provider. Subsurface lift stations do not have to be covered except for the value of electrical and pumping equipment therein.
- E. Flood Insurance The District will obtain and maintain adequate coverage on any facilities located in a special flood and mudslide prone areas.

#### 14. Planning and Performing Development:

A. The engineer should not be authorized to commence work on final plans and specifications until a determination has been made that the project can be planned and constructed within the estimated cost shown in paragraph "24" of this letter. The engineer may then proceed to develop final plans and specifications to be completed no later than 180 days from this date, and prepare bid documents. The Area Director is prepared to furnish the necessary guide to follow so as to keep the project plans and documents within our guidelines and requirements. The project should not be advertised for construction bids until all easements and enforceable options have been obtained, and total funds are committed or available for the project.

- B. The following documents will be submitted to Rural Development for review and must be concurred in by Rural Development prior to advertisement for construction bids:
  - 1. Final plans, specifications and bid documents.
  - 2. Applicant's letter on efforts to encourage small business and minority-owned business participation.
  - 3. Legal Service Agreements.
  - 4. Engineering Agreements.

Revision in these documents will be subject to Rural Development concurrence. Any agreements, contracts, etc. not reviewed and approved by Rural Development will not be eligible for payment from project funds or revenues from facilities financed by this Agency.

Prior to receipt of an authorization to advertise for construction bids, the District will obtain advance clearance from Bond Counsel regarding compliance with KRS 424 pertaining to publishing of the advertisement for construction bids in local newspapers and the period of time the notice is required to be published.

#### 15. Civil Rights & Equal Opportunity:

You should be aware of and will be required to comply with other federal statute requirements including but not limited to:

#### A. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973:

Under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. 794), no handicapped individual in the United States shall, solely by reason of their handicap, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Rural Development financial assistance.

#### B. Civil Rights Act of 1964:

All borrowers are subject to, and facilities must be operated in accordance with, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000d et seq.) and Subpart E of Part 1901 of this Title, particularly as it relates to conducting and reporting of compliance reviews. Instruments of conveyance for loans and/or grants subject to the Act must contain the covenant required by paragraph 1901.202(e) of this Title.

#### C. The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990:

This Act (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.) prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in employment, state and local government services, public transportation, public accommodations, facilities, and telecommunications. Title II of the Act applies to facilities operated by state and local public entities that

provide services, programs, and activities. Title III of the Act applies to facilities owned, leased, or operated by private entities that accommodate the public.

#### D. Age Discrimination Act of 1975:

This Act (42 U.S.C. 6101 et seq.) provides that no person in the United States shall, on the basis of age, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance.

Rural Development financial programs must be extended without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, marital status, age, or physical or mental handicap.

#### 16. <u>Closing Instructions</u>:

The Office of General Counsel, our Regional Attorney, will be required to write closing instructions in connection with this loan. Conditions listed therein must be met by the District.

#### 17. Compliance with Special Laws and Regulations:

The District will be required to conform to any and all state and local laws and regulations affecting this type project.

#### 18. <u>System Operator</u>:

The District is reminded that the system operator must have an Operator's Certificate issued by the State.

#### 19. Prior to Pre-Closing the Loan, the District Will Be Required to Adopt:

- A. Form RUS Bulletin 1780-27, "Loan Resolution (Public Bodies)."
- B. Form RD 400-1, "Equal Opportunity Agreement."
- C. Form RD 400-4, "Assurance Agreement."
- D. Form AD-1047, "Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, and Other Responsibility Matters Primary Covered Transaction."
- E. Form RD 1910-11, "Applicant Certification Federal Collection Policies for Consumer or Commercial Debts."
- F. RD Instruction 1940-Q, Exhibit A-1, "Certification for Contracts, Grants and Loans."
- G. RUS Bulletin 1780-22, "Eligibility Certification."

#### 20. Refinancing and Graduation Requirements:

The District is reminded that if at any time it shall appear to the Government that the District is able to refinance the amount of the RUS indebtedness then outstanding, in whole or in part, by obtaining a loan from commercial sources at reasonable rates and terms, upon the request of the Government, the District will apply for and accept such loan in sufficient amount to repay the Government.

#### 21. <u>Commercial Interim Financing</u>:

The District will be required to use commercial interim financing for the project during construction for the RUS loan portion of the financing, if available at reasonable rates and terms.

Before the loan is closed, the District will be required to provide Rural Development with statements from the contractor, engineer and attorneys that they have been paid to date in accordance with their contract or other agreements and, in the case of the contractor, that he has paid his suppliers and sub-contractors.

#### 22. Disbursement of Project Funds:

A construction account for the purpose of disbursement of project funds (RUS) will be established by the District prior to start of construction. The position of officials entrusted with the receipt and disbursement of RUS project funds will be covered by a "Fidelity Bond," with USDA Rural Development as Co-Obligee, in the amount of construction funds on hand at any one time during the construction phase.

For each "construction account" as established, if the amount of RUS loan and grant funds plus any applicant contributions or funds from other sources to be deposited into the account are expected to exceed \$100,000 at any time, the financial institution will secure the amount in excess of \$100,000 by pledging collateral with the Federal Reserve Bank in an amount not less than the excess in accordance with 7 CFR, 1902.7(a).

During construction, the District shall disburse project funds in a manner consistent with subsection 1780.76 (e) of RUS Instruction 1780. Form RD 1924-18, "Partial Payment Estimate," or similar form approved by Rural Development, shall be used for the purpose of documenting periodic construction estimates, and shall be submitted to Rural Development for review and acceptance. Prior to disbursement of funds by the District, the Board of Directors shall review and approve <u>each</u> payment estimate. All bills and vouchers must be approved by Rural Development prior to payment by the District.

Form RD 440-11, "Estimate of Funds Needed for 30-Day Period Commencing \_\_\_\_\_," will be prepared by the District and submitted to Rural Development in order that a periodic advance of federal cash may be requested.

Borrowers receiving federal loan and/or grant funds by EFT will have funds directly deposited to a specified account at a financial institution with funds being available to the recipient on the date of payment. The borrower should complete Form SF-3881, "Electronic Funds Transfer Payment Enrollment Form," for each account where funds will be electronically received. The

completed form(s) must be received by Rural Development at least thirty (30) days prior to the first advance of funds.

Monthly audits of the District's construction account records shall be made by Rural Development.

#### 23. Disbursement of Grant Funds:

The RUS funds will be advanced as they are needed in the amount(s) necessary to cover the RUS proportionate share of obligations due and payable by the District. Grant funds, upon receipt, must be deposited in an interest bearing account in accordance with 7 CFR part 3016 (as applicable). Interest earned on grant funds in excess of \$100 (as applicable) per year will be submitted to RUS at least quarterly.

#### 25. Commitment of Other Project Funds:

This Letter of Conditions is issued contingent upon a firm commitment being in effect prior to advertising for construction bids for the ARC grant in the amount of \$500,000.

#### 26. Use of Remaining Project Funds:

The applicant contribution shall be considered as the first funds expended. After providing for all authorized costs, any remaining project funds will be considered to be RUS/ARC grant funds and refunded in proportion to participation in the project. If the amount of unused project funds exceeds the grants, that part would be RUS loan funds.

#### 27. Proposed Operating Budget:

You will be required to submit to Rural Development a copy of your proposed annual operating budget that supports the proposed loan repayment prior to this agency giving you written

authorization to proceed with the bidding phase. The operating budget should be based on a typical year cash flow, subject to completion of this project in the first full year of operation. Form RD 442-7, "Operating Budget," or similar form may be utilized for this purpose.

#### 28. Rates and Charges:

Rates and charges for facilities and services rendered by the District must be at least adequate to meet cost of maintaining, repairing and operating the water system and meeting required principal and interest payments and the required deposits to debt service and/or depreciation reserve.

Water rates will be at least:

First 2,000 gallons @ \$ 19.90 - Minimum Bill. All Over 2,000 gallons @ \$ 9.95 - per 1,000 gallons.

#### 29. Water Purchase Contract:

The District will submit a Water Purchase Contract for approval by Rural Development before advertising for construction bids. If the contract is not on Form RD 442-30, "Water Purchase Contract," the contract will require approval by our Regional Attorney. The contract must meet the requirements of subsection 1780.62 of RUS Instruction 1780.

#### 30. Compliance with the Bioterrorism Act:

Prior to pre-closing the loan, the District will provide a certification they have completed a Vulnerability Assessment (VA) and prepared an emergency response plan (ERP) as required by the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA).

#### 31. Floodplain Construction:

The District will be required to pass and adopt a Resolution or amend its By-Laws whereby the District will deny any water service to any future customer wishing to build on or develop property located within a designated floodplain. If a customer or developer requests service for construction in a designated floodplain, the customer or developer must provide evidence and a justification for approval by the District and Rural Development officials that there are no other alternatives to construction or development within the designated floodplain. The community must be a participant in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) and the customer or developer must obtain the required permits prior to the tap on restrictions being waived.

#### 32. Mitigation Measures:

- A. The project shall be in compliance with all requirements noted in the Governor's Office for Local Development letter dated October 25, 2007, from Ms. Lee Nalley.
- B. The line design and construction shall be accomplished in a way that will leave flood plains and farmland without effect after construction is complete. The Army Corps of Engineers Nationwide Permit No. 12 applies to all floodplain and wetland utility line construction.

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- C. Any excavation by Contractor that uncovers a historical or archaeological artifact shall be immediately reported to Owner and a representative of Agency. Construction shall be temporarily halted pending the notification process and further directions issued by Agency after consultation with the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO).
- D. The design and construction shall be in compliance with all local, state and federal environmental statutes, regulations and executive orders applicable to the project.
- E. Best Management Practices shall be incorporated into the project design, construction, and maintenance.

#### 33. Final Approval Conditions:

Final approval of this assistance will depend on your willingness, with the assistance of all your co-workers, to meet the conditions of this letter in an orderly and systematic manner. Then too. final approval will depend on funds being available.

If you desire to proceed with your application, the Area Director will allot a reasonable portion of time to provide guidance in application processing.

The Second Paragraph on Page 1 is revised to read as follows:

"This letter is not to be considered as loan and/or grant approval or as a representation as to the availability of funds. The docket may be completed on the basis of a RUS loan not to exceed \$350,000, a RUS grant not to exceed \$250,000, an Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) grant of \$500,000, and a Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) of \$862,800."





#### Chapter 2 - Project Planning Area


Breathitt County Water District (BCWD) is a Class "C" Water District organized in August 2003 by the Breathitt County Judge Executive. The County Judge then appointed five commissioners to serve on the Water District's Board. These five commissioners subsequently then selected a Chairman from the appointed board.

Currently, the BCWD has approximately 620 customers; however, once the KY 1110 Phase-1 and KY 15 Watts Waterline Extension projects are put into full service (estimated to be Summer 2009) the number of customers could increase to over 900 households. In addition to these customers, at the completion of the KY 30 West and KY 3237 (Canoe) projects (by the end of 2009) and the KY 1110 Phase-2 project (by early 2010), the District's customer base could increase to above 1000 households.

Jackson, the county seat, operates an independent water system (Jackson Municipal Water Works), drawing water from the North Fork of the Kentucky River. The system currently serves 2,000 households. The water treatment plant (WTP), capable of producing 2.5 MGD, is expected to supply the potable water product to the various Breathitt County water line extensions. Daily production by Jackson Municipal Water Works is currently 800,000 gallons (33% of plant capacity) and their storage capacity is presently 925,000 gallons. The 300,000-gallon Highland Avenue water storage tank will provide storage for the proposed KY 30 East Waterline Extension. This proposed project is the seventh (7<sup>th</sup>) project of this type in BCWD's effort to deliver potable drinking water to all residents outside Jackson's service area. Jackson's WTP is expected to have more than adequate capacity to supply the needed potable water for this proposed project.

See Figure 2 which shows the Water Distribution Project Area for this project.

Breathitt County has 6,170 occupied housing units per the 2000 US Census report. The KY 30 East Water Main Extension project area has approximately 200 residential households. This project has a maximum concentration of greater than 10 customers per mile plus it would provide water to an elementary school that is now being supplied by an on-site system. Most of the housing in the area is currently served by privately operated wells. Most of the water obtained from drilled wells in Breathitt County is extremely hard and contains noticeable amounts of iron.

#### Chapter 3 - Existing Facilities/Need for Project

There is no potable water service in the proposed project area other than the on-site treatment plant at the Rousseau Elementary School. Residents in this area must rely either on wells, springs or hauled water for their domestic water needs. Breathitt County is one of the last counties in the Commonwealth to be provided treated water in the rural areas of the County.

The well water is extremely hard and contains noticeable amounts of iron. Salty water may be found from 50 feet to several hundred feet below the level of the principal valley bottoms. Where springs supply water, the yield is rarely more than 5 GPM. A more reliable and healthy source for water is needed.

The proposed project will consist of approximately 6 miles in the Base Bid area and 13 miles in the Additive Alternate Number 1 area, of various sized water lines ranging from 8 inch to 2 inch diameter. These waterlines will be served by a master meter connection between BCWD and Jackson Municipal Water Works along KY 30 East.

This proposed project could bring potable water service to some 200 homes and churches within the project area plus the Rousseau Elementary School.

The 2000 US Census reports 2.61 persons per household so the maximum total service population will be to  $(2.61 \times 200 = 522 \text{ persons})$  approximately 500 people. At a conservative usage rate of 100 gallons per person per day, this would equate to an average day base requirement of 50,000 GPD for the 200 homes in the project area.

#### Chapter 4 - Proposed Project/Project Cost/Financing

The proposed potable KY 30 East Waterline Extension consists of two contracts. The waterline contract is Contract # 1 which consists of two segments, the Base Bid (BB)( booster pump station and 6.15 miles of waterline) and the Additive Alternate (AA) Number 1 (consists of 13.08 miles of proposed waterlines). This is a total of approximately 101,500 feet of waterline ranging from 8-inch to 2-inch in diameter. Contract # 2 consists of the construction of two storage tanks

The BB and AA were advertised in the local newspaper and the Lexington Herald-Leader and bids for these segments were opened and read at the Breathitt County Court House at 3:30 P.M. on April 15, 2009. Eleven contractors ordered plans for Contract # 1, the waterlines, and eight contractors submitted sealed bids for Contract # 1 (this contract included both the BB and the AA). Four contractors ordered plans for Contract # 2, the tanks, and two contractors submitted sealed bids for Contract # 2. See the Certified Bid Tabulations for both to these contracts in Appendix "A" of this report.

Both of the low bid contractors had previously completed contracts for the Water District and performed in performed their duties in exemplary fashion. Therefore, and due to other prior experience with these contractors, a letter of recommendation to award the low bids pending available funding, the concurrence of the funding agencies and the Public Service Commission was easy to write to the District.

By adding the two low BB's for Contract #1 and Contract #2 (\$592,249.51 + 288,500 = \$880,749.51), one can then subtract this total from the Rural Development's revised Letter of Conditions (dated 4/28/09) Development line item (\$1,565,201) to see what amount of funds remain for the AA. The total remaining amount of the RD Development line item is therefore (\$1,565,201 – 880,749.51) \$684,451.49. The total bid amount for AA was \$846,783.83. At this time, only \$684,451.49 of the AA will be added to the BB by change order, which will coincide with the RD Development amount. Keep in mind there is also \$80,000 in contingencies which could be used for line installation if not needed during construction.

The Total Opinion of Probable Project Cost, the Sources of Project Funding and the Annual Required Revenue are all provided in Appendix "B" of this report. This spreadsheet also verifies that there will not have to be a rate increase in user rates to adequately finance this project.

#### Chapter 5 - Conclusions & Recommendations

To provide water service to the residents on KY 30 East, the new water lines, booster stations and storage tanks are necessary. In addition, waterline extensions along the branch roads off KY 30 East (such as Lick Branch, Meatscaffold Road, and Hunting Creek) could now be made or reached more feasibly in the very near future.

The health, environmental, land use, and economic enhancement issues combined necessitate the need for this water system extension in Breathitt County.

The existing City of Jackson water main on KY 30 East, stops just after the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet's Maintenance Garage. This proposed project will also provide a reliable water supply to the additional customers along the branch roads off KY 30 East. Additionally, the availability of reliable, clean, and chlorinated water from the centralized source will improve the economy of scale for both the BCWD and the Jackson Municipal Water Works.

On April 15, 2009 at the Breathitt County Court House, eight (8) bids were received for Contract # 1, and two (2) bids were received for Contract # 2 of the above referenced project. Certified bid tabulations were prepared by our office for each contract and mailed to you for your information and files.

After the Certified Bid Tabulations were prepared, a reference check was eliminated, since both Nesbitt Engineering, Inc. (NEI) and the District have conducted multiple successful projects with both of the apparent low bidders. Based on past experiences, we conclude that both, G&W Construction Co., Inc. (Contract 1) and Laurel Construction Company, Inc. (Contract 2), qualify as responsive and responsible bidders, and are unaware of any reason a construction contract should not be awarded to them. Therefore, NEI recommends that Breathitt County Water District (BCWD) award Contract # 1 to G&W Construction Co., Inc. in the amount of \$592,249.51 and Contract #2 to Laurel Construction Company, Inc for \$288,500.00.

Issuance of the "Notice of Award" for each Contract is recommended pending concurrence of the Kentucky Public Service Commission, and all other Funding Agencies.

After providing for all authorized costs, any remaining project funds will be considered to be RUS/ARC/CDBG grant funds and refunded in proportion to participation in the project. If the amount of unused project funds exceeds the grants, that part would be RUS loan funds. "

#### 1 Number of Users and Their Contribution:

There shall be 884 water users, of which 420 are existing users, 414 are users from projects under construction, and 50 are new users. The Area Director will review and authenticate the number of users prior to advertising for construction bids.

#### 1. Grant Agreement:

Attached is a copy of RUS Bulletin 1780-12, "Water and Waste System Grant Agreement," for your review. You will be required to execute a completed form at the time of grant closing.

#### 3. Drug-Free Work Place:

Prior to grant closing, the District will be required to execute Form AD-1049, "Certification Regarding Drug-Free Workplace Requirements (Grants) Alternative I - For Grantees Other Than Individuals."

#### 4. Repayment Period:

The loan will be scheduled for repayment over a period not to exceed 40 years from the date of the Bond. Principal payment will not be deferred for a period in excess of two years from the date of the Bond. Payments will be in accordance with applicable KRS, which requires interest to be paid semi-annually (January 1st and July 1st) and principal will be due on or before the first of January. Rural Development may require the District to adopt a supplemental payment agreement providing for monthly payments of principal and interest so long as the bond is held or insured by RUS. Monthly payments will be approximate amortized installments.

#### 5. Recommended Repayment Method:

Payments on this loan shall be made using the Preauthorized Debit (PAD) payment method. This procedure eliminates the need for paper checks and ensures timely receipt of RD loan payments. To initiate PAD payments, Form SF 5510, "Authorization Agreement for Preauthorized Payments," should be signed by the District to authorize the electronic withdrawal of funds from your designated bank account on the exact installment payment due date. The Area Director will furnish the necessary forms and further guidance on the PAD procedure.

#### 6. Reserve Accounts:

Reserves must be properly budgeted to maintain the financial viability of any operation. Reserves are important to fund unanticipated emergency maintenance, pay for repairs, and assist with debt service should the need arise.

The District will be required to deposit \$125 per month into a "Funded Depreciation Reserve Account" until the account reaches \$15,000. The deposits are to be resumed any time the account falls below the \$15,000.

The required monthly deposits to the Reserve Account and required Reserve Account levels are in addition to the requirements of the District's prior bond resolutions.

The monthly deposits to the Reserve Account are required to commence with the first month of the first full fiscal year after the facility becomes operational.

The District also needs to fund an account for short-lived assets by depositing a sum of \$1,600 monthly into the account. The funds in the short-lived asset account may be used by the District as needed to replace or add short-lived assets in the District's water system.

#### 7. <u>Security Requirements</u>:

A pledge of gross water revenue will be provided in the Bond Resolution. Bonds shall rank on a parity with existing bonds, if possible.

If this is not possible, the bond will be subordinate and junior to the existing bonds, in which case the District will be required to abrogate its right to issue additional bonds ranking on a parity with the existing bonds, so long as any unpaid indebtedness remains on this bond issue.

#### 8. <u>Land Rights and Real Property</u>:

The District will be required to furnish satisfactory title, easements, etc., necessary to install, maintain and operate the facility to serve the intended users. The pipelines will be on private rights-of-way where feasible. Easements and options are to be secured prior to advertising for construction bids.

#### 9. Organization:

The District will be legally organized under applicable KRS which will permit them to perform this service, borrow and repay money.

#### 10. Business Operations:

The District will be required to operate the system under a well-established set of resolutions, rules and regulations. A budget must be established annually and adopted by the District after review by Rural Development. At no later than loan pre-closing, the District will be required to furnish a prior approved management plan to include, as a minimum, provisions for management, maintenance, meter reading, miscellaneous services, billing, collecting, delayed payment penalties, disconnect/reconnect fees, bookkeeping, making and delivering required reports and audits.

#### 11. Accounts, Records and Audits:

The District will be required to maintain adequate records and accounts and submit annual budgets and year-end reports (annual audits) /statistical and financial reports, quarterly and annually, in accordance with subsection 1780.47 of RUS Instruction 1780.

The enclosed audit booklet will be used as a guide for preparation of audits. The District shall be required to submit a copy of its audit agreement for review and concurrence by Rural Development prior to pre-closing the loan.

The District shall obtain the assistance of its accountant to establish the District's accounting system. Rural Development review of the accounting system is required.

12. Accomplish Audits for Years in Which Federal Financial Assistance is Received:

The District will accomplish audits in accordance with OMB Circular A-133, during the years in which federal funds are received. The District will provide copies of the audits to the Area Office and the appropriate Federal cognizant agency as designated by OMB Circular A-133.

#### 13. <u>Insurance and Bonding:</u>

The following insurance and bonding will be required:

- A. Adequate <u>Liability and Property Damage</u> Insurance including vehicular coverage, if applicable, must be obtained and maintained by the District. The District should obtain amounts of coverage as recommended by its attorney, consulting engineer and/or insurance provider.
- B. Worker's Compensation The District will carry worker's compensation insurance for employees in accordance with applicable state laws.
- C. <u>Fidelity Bond</u>. The District will provide Fidelity Bond Coverage for all persons who have access to funds. Coverage may be provided either for all individual positions or persons, or through "blanket" coverage providing protection for all appropriate employees and/or officials. The amount of coverage required for all RUS loans is \$15,000.
- D. Real Property Insurance The District will obtain and maintain adequate fire and extended coverage on all structures including major items of equipment or machinery located in the structures. The amounts of coverage should be based on recommendations obtained by the District from its attorney, consulting engineer and/or insurance provider. Subsurface lift stations do not have to be covered except for the value of electrical and pumping equipment therein.
- E. Flood Insurance The District will obtain and maintain adequate coverage on any facilities located in a special flood and mudslide prone areas.

#### 14. <u>Planning and Performing Development:</u>

A. The engineer should not be authorized to commence work on final plans and specifications until a determination has been made that the project can be planned and constructed within the estimated cost shown in paragraph "24" of this letter. The engineer may then proceed to develop final plans and specifications to be completed no later than 180 days from this date, and prepare bid documents. The Area Director is prepared to furnish the necessary guide to follow so as to keep the project plans and documents within our guidelines and requirements. The project should not be advertised for construction bids until all easements and enforceable options have been obtained, and total funds are committed or available for the project.

- B. The following documents will be submitted to Rural Development for review and must be concurred in by Rural Development prior to advertisement for construction bids:
  - 1. Final plans, specifications and bid documents.
  - 2. Applicant's letter on efforts to encourage small business and minority-owned business participation.
  - 3. Legal Service Agreements.
  - 4. Engineering Agreements.

Revision in these documents will be subject to Rural Development concurrence. Any agreements, contracts, etc. not reviewed and approved by Rural Development will not be eligible for payment from project funds or revenues from facilities financed by this Agency.

Prior to receipt of an authorization to advertise for construction bids, the District will obtain advance clearance from Bond Counsel regarding compliance with KRS 424 pertaining to publishing of the advertisement for construction bids in local newspapers and the period of time the notice is required to be published.

#### 15. Civil Rights & Equal Opportunity:

You should be aware of and will be required to comply with other federal statute requirements including but not limited to:

#### A. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973:

Under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. 794), no handicapped individual in the United States shall, solely by reason of their handicap, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Rural Development financial assistance.

#### B. Civil Rights Act of 1964:

All borrowers are subject to, and facilities must be operated in accordance with, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000d et seq.) and Subpart E of Part 1901 of this Title, particularly as it relates to conducting and reporting of compliance reviews. Instruments of conveyance for loans and/or grants subject to the Act must contain the covenant required by paragraph 1901.202(e) of this Title.

#### C. The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990:

This Act (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.) prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in employment, state and local government services, public transportation, public accommodations, facilities, and telecommunications. #### 17. Compliance with Special Laws and Regulations:

The District will be required to conform to any and all state and local laws and regulations affecting this type project.

#### 18. <u>System Operator</u>:

The District is reminded that the system operator must have an Operator's Certificate issued by the State.

#### 19. Prior to Pre-Closing the Loan, the District Will Be Required to Adopt:

- A. Form RUS Bulletin 1780-27, "Loan Resolution (Public Bodies)."
- B. Form RD 400-1, "Equal Opportunity Agreement."
- C. Form RD 400-4, "Assurance Agreement."
- D. Form AD-1047, "Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, and Other Responsibility Matters Primary Covered Transaction."
- E. Form RD 1910-11, "Applicant Certification Federal Collection Policies for Consumer or Commercial Debts."
- F. RD Instruction 1940-Q, Exhibit A-1, "Certification for Contracts, Grants and Loans."
- G. RUS Bulletin 1780-22, "Eligibility Certification."

#### 20. Refinancing and Graduation Requirements:

The District is reminded that if at any time it shall appear to the Government that the District is able to refinance the amount of the RUS indebtedness then outstanding, in whole or in part, by obtaining a loan from commercial sources at reasonable rates and terms, upon the request of the Government, the District will apply for and accept such loan in sufficient amount to repay the Government.

#### 21. Commercial Interim Financing:

The District will be required to use commercial interim financing for the project during construction for the RUS loan portion of the financing, if available at reasonable rates and terms.

Before the loan is closed, the District will be required to provide Rural Development with statements from the contractor, engineer and attorneys that they have been paid to date in accordance with their contract or other agreements and, in the case of the contractor, that he has paid his suppliers and sub-contractors.

#### 22. Disbursement of Project Funds:

A construction account for the purpose of disbursement of project funds (RUS) will be established by the District prior to start of construction. The position of officials entrusted with the receipt and disbursement of RUS project funds will be covered by a "Fidelity Bond," with USDA Rural Development as Co-Obligee, in the amount of construction funds on hand at any one time during the construction phase.

For each "construction account" as established, if the amount of RUS loan and grant funds plus any applicant contributions or funds from other sources to be deposited into the account are expected to exceed \$100,000 at any time, the financial institution will secure the amount in excess of \$100,000 by pledging collateral with the Federal Reserve Bank in an amount not less than the excess in accordance with 7 CFR, 1902.7(a).

During construction, the District shall disburse project funds in a manner consistent with subsection 1780.76 (e) of RUS Instruction 1780. Form RD 1924-18, "Partial Payment Estimate," or similar form approved by Rural Development, shall be used for the purpose of documenting periodic construction estimates, and shall be submitted to Rural Development for review and acceptance. Prior to disbursement of funds by the District, the Board of Directors shall review and approve each payment estimate. All bills and vouchers must be approved by Rural Development prior to payment by the District.

Form RD 440-11, "Estimate of Funds Needed for 30-Day Period Commencing \_\_\_\_\_\_," will be prepared by the District and submitted to Rural Development in order that a periodic advance of federal cash may be requested.

Borrowers receiving federal loan and/or grant funds by EFT will have funds directly deposited to a specified account at a financial institution with funds being available to the recipient on the date of payment. The borrower should complete Form SF-3881, "Electronic Funds Transfer Payment Enrollment Form," for each account where funds will be electronically received. The

completed form(s) must be received by Rural Development at least thirty (30) days prior to the first advance of funds.

Monthly audits of the District's construction account records shall be made by Rural Development.

#### 23. Disbursement of Grant Funds:

The RUS funds will be advanced as they are needed in the amount(s) necessary to cover the RUS proportionate share of obligations due and payable by the District. Grant funds, upon receipt, must be deposited in an interest bearing account in accordance with 7 CFR part 3016 (as applicable). Interest earned on grant funds in excess of \$100 (as applicable) per year will be submitted to RUS at least quarterly.

#### 25. Commitment of Other Project Funds:

This Letter of Conditions is issued contingent upon a firm commitment being in effect prior to advertising for construction bids for the ARC grant in the amount of \$500,000.

#### 26. <u>Use of Remaining Project Funds:</u>

The applicant contribution shall be considered as the first funds expended. After providing for all authorized costs, any remaining project funds will be considered to be RUS/ARC grant funds and refunded in proportion to participation in the project. If the amount of unused project funds exceeds the grants, that part would be RUS loan funds.

#### 27. Proposed Operating Budget:

You will be required to submit to Rural Development a copy of your proposed annual operating budget that supports the proposed loan repayment prior to this agency giving you written

authorization to proceed with the bidding phase. The operating budget should be based on a typical year cash flow, subject to completion of this project in the first full year of operation. Form RD 442-7, "Operating Budget," or similar form may be utilized for this purpose.

#### 28. Rates and Charges:

Rates and charges for facilities and services rendered by the District must be at least adequate to meet cost of maintaining, repairing and operating the water system and meeting required principal and interest payments and the required deposits to debt service and/or depreciation reserve.

Water rates will be at least:

First 2,000 gallons @ \$ 19.90 - Minimum Bill. All Over 2,000 gallons @ \$ 9.95 - per 1,000 gallons.

#### 29. Water Purchase Contract:

The District will submit a Water Purchase Contract for approval by Rural Development before advertising for construction bids. If the contract is not on Form RD 442-30, "Water Purchase Contract," the contract will require approval by our Regional Attorney. The contract must meet the requirements of subsection 1780.62 of RUS Instruction 1780.

#### 30. Compliance with the Bioterrorism Act:

Prior to pre-closing the loan, the District will provide a certification they have completed a Vulnerability Assessment (VA) and prepared an emergency response plan (ERP) as required by the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA).

#### 31. <u>Floodplain Construction</u>:

The District will be required to pass and adopt a Resolution or amend its By-Laws whereby the District will deny any water service to any future customer wishing to build on or develop property located within a designated floodplain. If a customer or developer requests service for construction in a designated floodplain, the customer or developer must provide evidence and a justification for approval by the District and Rural Development officials that there are no other alternatives to construction or development within the designated floodplain. The community must be a participant in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) and the customer or developer must obtain the required permits prior to the tap on restrictions being waived.

#### 32. Mitigation Measures:

- A. The project shall be in compliance with all requirements noted in the Governor's Office for Local Development letter dated October 25, 2007, from Ms. Lee Nalley
- B. The line design and construction shall be accomplished in a way that will leave flood plains and farmland without effect after construction is complete. The Army Corps of Engineers Nationwide Permit No. 12 applies to all floodplain and wetland utility line construction.

- C. Any excavation by Contractor that uncovers a historical or archaeological artifact shall be immediately reported to Owner and a representative of Agency. Construction shall be temporarily halted pending the notification process and further directions issued by Agency after consultation with the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO).
- D. The design and construction shall be in compliance with all local, state and federal environmental statutes, regulations and executive orders applicable to the project.
- E. Best Management Practices shall be incorporated into the project design, construction, and maintenance.

#### 33. Final Approval Conditions:

Final approval of this assistance will depend on your willingness, with the assistance of all your co-workers, to meet the conditions of this letter in an orderly and systematic manner. Then too, final approval will depend on funds being available.

If you desire to proceed with your application, the Area Director will allot a reasonable portion of time to provide guidance in application processing.
