Dear Mr. DeRouen,

As a concerned ratepayer, I am writing you to convey my opposition for the projects which E.ON, parent company of LG&E and KU, has proposed: the expansion of an ash impoundment and construction of a scrubber waste pond at the Trimble County Generating Station and the expansion of major ash impoundments at the E.W. Brown Generating Station.

Currently the EPA is taking measures to regulate hazardous coal ash. As we now know, coal ash contains heavy metals, including selenium, mercury, arsenic, and lead. It has caused documented damage to

community health and ecosystems across the country. It has become ever clearer, since the disastrous Kingston coal ash spill a year ago, that coal ash and other coal plant waste is highly toxic and should not be stored in wet ponds or discharged to ground or surface waters.

Further, these projects serve as a potential threat to critically important water resources. The Trimble facility, which sits not far upstream of Louisville's drinking water intakes, imperils the Ohio River. The Brown Facility on Herrington Lake not only sits next to a major recreational water location, but it also threatens the Dix River and the Kentucky River downstream. My family lives in Louisville, and I will not stand idle as E.ON

endangers their health and the health of Ohio River ecosystems, such as they are. I therefore ask the Public Service Commission to DENY the utilities' applications to expand coal ash slurry impoundments within the Commonwealth.
