- 1. Applicant, East Kentucky Power Cooperative, Inc., hereinafter referred to as "EKPC", Post Office Box 707, 4775 Lexington Road, Winchester, Kentucky 40392-0707, hereby files this Application for authority to continue the Touchstone Energy Home Program (the "Program") through 2011.
 - 2. This Application is made pursuant to KRS 278.285 and related statutes.
- 3. A copy of Applicant's restated Articles of Incorporation and all amendments thereto were filed with the Public Service Commission (the "Commission") in PSC Case No. 90-197, the Application of East Kentucky Power Cooperative, Inc. for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Construct Certain Steam Service Facilities in Mason County, Kentucky.
- 4. Attached as Applicant's Exhibit I is the Prepared Testimony of Jeffry E. Hohman, EKPC Manager of Member Services. Mr. Hohman's testimony explains EKPC's history with the Touchstone Energy Home Program which was approved by the Commission in its order dated January 14, 2004 in PSC Case No. 2003-00481, and the

extension of the rebate provisions, which was approved by the Commission in its order dated September 18, 2007 in PSC Case No. 2006-00547.

- 5. EKPC is hereby requesting approval to extend its Touchstone Energy Home Program, which includes the rebate provision, through the end of 2011.
- 6. Attached as Applicant's Exhibit II is a revised tariff sheet for EKPC's Section DSM-2 Rate Schedule, showing the proposed changes.

WHEREFORE, Applicant respectfully requests the Commission to authorize the continuation of the Touchstone Energy Home Program, which includes the rebate provisions, through the end of 2011.

3	Q	Please explain the history of EKPC's Touchstone Energy Home
4		Program (the "Program").
5	A.	The Public Service Commission (the "Commission") approved the
6		Program in January 2004 in PSC Case No. 2003-00481. The Program was
7		designed to encourage the construction of energy efficient homes. The
8		Program requires that these new homes meet Energy Star standards set
9		forth by the U.S. Department of Energy. EKPC's Program, as approved
10		by the Commission in September 2007, allows for EKPC to offer a rebate
11		of up to \$250 per home. The Touchstone Energy Home's rebate provision
12		has been in operation since the spring of 2004 and has proven to be
13		popular with customers.
14	Q.	Why is EKPC requesting an extension of the Program, including the
15		rebate provisions?
16	A.	As indicated in our original filing, the incremental cost of a Touchstone
17		Energy Home is over \$2,000 higher than a conventional home. The rebate
18		provision has helped mitigate the increased up-front cost to consumers and
19		reduces the payback period of the investment in the Touchstone Energy
20		Home. In order to continue making progress in the promotion of energy
21		efficient homes, EKPC and its Member Systems believe that the rebate
22		provision offers the best opportunity to succeed.

Q. Has the Program been successful?

A. Yes. The Program has proven to be very successful. The number of 2 participants has grown from 44 as of the end of 2004 to a total of 175 as of 3 the end of 2005. In 2006, 236 customers purchased Touchstone Energy 4 5 Homes and in 2007 there were 116 Touchstone Energy Homes that were given rebates by EKPC. In 2008, 104 participants were added. It has 6 7 been EKPC's experience that the up-front incentives can be a deciding 8 factor in the ultimate decision-making process of new homebuyers, and 9 the rebate provision encourages new homebuyers to more strongly 10 consider the highly efficient Touchstone Energy Home.

Q. Is the Program designed to encourage changes in a customer's consumption patterns?

A. Yes. The Program is designed to encourage new construction of energy efficient homes. It is estimated that incorporating Energy Star standards into construction can save the member as much as 30 percent each month on their electric usage.

Q. Is this Program consistent with all aspects of EKPC's 2009 Integrated Resource Plan ("IRP")?

A. Yes. This Program continues to support the goals set forth in the 2009

IRP to delay baseload and offset peaking units. The Program descriptions are found in the 2009 IRP appendix page DSM-74 (Touchstone Energy Home).

1	Q.	Does this Program result in any unreasonable prejudice or
2		disadvantage to any customer class?
3	A.	No. This Program is easily available and affordable for members
4		purchasing new homes. Green building is on the upswing in Kentucky.
5	Q.	Have you prepared an Exhibit which reflects EKPC's proposed
6		change to the program?
7	A.	Yes. Exhibit II to the Application is a proposed Tariff sheet which
8		incorporates the extension of the Program, including the rebate provision,
9		through the end of 2011. Page 2 of the Exhibit is the redline version of
10		the Tariff change.
