## KIRKSVILLE WATER ASSOCIATION'S RESPONSE TO THE INFORMATION REQUEST FROM THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

Comes Kirksville Water Association, by counsel, and to cure the deficiencies in the previous filing and to more accurately state their request to fairly allocate the cost of the administration of credit cards and states as follows:

Attached hereto as Exhibit A. are the (1) Associations By-Laws, (2) a copy of the public notice that was advertised, (3) the Superintendent's original response dated August 12, 2009, (4) profit and loss statements for the most recent 12 month period, (5) excel spreadsheet showing average cost of credit card use per credit card user and (6) Merchant Card Processing statements. The objections outlined in the letter to counsel dated October 5, 2009, are addressed in the following response.

- 1. Kirksville Water Association withdraws its request to include the .15 cent bank draft charge as a recoverable cost.
- 2. The remaining request is to pass the approximate cost of the administration of credit card use on to only those customers who use credit cards. Prior to Case No. 2009-00315, Kirksville Water Association (hereinafter "KWA") has not made a request to include this charge in a rate filing. The Commission defines this as a nonrecurring charge and applies the requirements of 807 KAR 5:011(10). The difficulty in definition is that

a traditional nonrecurring charge is limited in nature and once the service requiring a charge is complete, no further charges are anticipated. Unlike nonrecurring charges intended to be covered by 807 KAR 5:011(10), credit cards are a preferred payment method for a significant number of customers and one they use every month.

Accordingly, the costs associated with using the credit card occur on a regular basis. However, like traditionally defined nonrecurring charges, the expense of the credit card is limited in nature and designed to recover the specific cost of the activity. Because this is an expense that occurs on a regular basis, KWA previously preceded as if the cost of credit card use was outside the scope of 807 KAR 5:011(10). KWA now seeks the Commission's approval of the method by which KWA arrived at the pass through cost and authority to pass the cost on to its customers.

3. KWA took the total amount of charges incurred by the Association from the use of credit cards and divided that number by the total number of customers using a credit card. KWA then rounded down to two dollars (\$2.00). While possible to determine what each customer's use of a credit card costs KWA, it is not feasible to accurately account for that total and then add that cost to the customer's bill. Office staff has no way of knowing what the credit card charge will be until after the card is used. The processing agent classifies cards according to specific industry standards that are not apparent on the face of the card. To pass the true cost on to the customer, staff would have to review each credit card statement and then add a line item to each bill that was previously paid by credit card. The substantial administrative hours required to perform those tasks are too burdensome for the small staff of the Association. Therefore, the only

feasible way to allow credit card use was to use a flat fee that most closely approximated the cost.

- 4. It is this \$2.00 cost the KWA seeks permission from the PSC to pass on to only those customers benefiting from the convenience of credit card payment. The collection of the \$2.00 fee will **not** result in additional revenue. The cost of the credit card administration slightly exceeds the \$2.00 fee. This is an attempt by the Association to offer this service in as close a revenue neutral manner as possible. 807 KAR 5:011(10)(2). KWA is under no obligation to accept credit/debit card transactions and does so as a convenience to its customers who request that service. If the cost of the service is not passed on to the customer benefiting from the convenience it is necessarily spread amongst all of the Association's customers through the general expense of the Association. Passing the cost on directly to those customers who chose the service properly allocates the expense to those who benefit. Accordingly KWA has three options related to credit card use: (1) Despite repeated customer requests, don't offer it (2) Offer it and spread the cost among all customers, even those who don't benefit from the service or (3) Offer the service and spread the cost only among those who use the service. KWA submits option three is the fairest and most sensible option. Waiting until the next rate filing will require that either option (1) or option (2) be employed during the interim. The duty to comply with the reasonable requests of Association members and fairness dictate that the Association move as quickly as possible to provide this service for its customers accustomed to using this payment method.
- 5. KWA believes that using a flat fee that is based upon the average cost per credit card user fairly allocates the cost amongst those who choose the service. KWA

does not have any industrial or large commercial customers that use a credit card so there is no one in the pool of users that skews the average. To further ensure an accurate average cost, any bill in excess of \$250 paid by credit card will be handled outside of the flat fee convenience charge and that customer will be assessed the dollar for dollar cost.

6. The contract between KWA and the credit card processing agent contains no language that would prevent a pass through cost.

Wherefore, KWA requests it be allowed to fairly allocate the cost of the use of credit cards to KWA customers who benefit from the use of credit cards and requests that the Commission rely on the authority provided in 807 KAR 5:011(14) to grant permission.

#### **BY-LAWS**

OF

#### KIRKSVILLE WATER ASSOCIATION, INC., NONPROFIT CORPORATION

## Article I GENERAL PURPOSES

The purpose for which this corporation is formed, and the powers which it may exercise are set forth in the Articles of Incorporation of the corporation.

## Article II NAME AND LOCATION

- Section 1. The name of this corporation is Kirksville Water Association, Inc.
- Section 2. The principal office of this corporation shall be located in Richmond, Madison County, Kentucky, but the corporation may maintain offices and places of business at such other places within the state as the board of directors may determine.
- Section 3. The registered agent of the corporation is presently elected President of the Association, Billy May, 155 North Keeneland Drive, Richmond, Kentucky 40475.

#### Article III SEAL

- Section 1. The seal of the corporation shall have inscribed thereon the name of the corporation, "Kentucky", and "corporate seal".
  - Section 2. The secretary of the corporation shall have custody of the seal.
- Section 3. The seal may be used by causing it or a facsimile thereof to be impressed or affixed or reproduced or otherwise.

#### Article IV FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the corporation shall begin the first day of January in each year.

#### Article V MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Any bona fide occupant of a dwelling, farm or other property, including schools, churches, community and similar organizations, and where otherwise necessary by contract with said organization, corporation, etc., having reasonable accessibility to the source of and who is in need of having water supplied for domestic, livestock and other purposes from the water system operated by the corporation and who receives the approval of the board of directors may be admitted to membership upon subscribing for and by signing such agreements for the purchase of water as may be provided and required by the corporation; provided that no person otherwise eligible shall be permitted to subscribe for or acquire a membership of the corporation if the capacity of the corporation's water system is exhausted by the needs of its existing members. The membership fee shall be a deposit, as approved by the Public Service Commission of Frankfort, at the time of application for membership.

Section 2. In case of the death of a member or if a member ceases to be eligible to hold membership as provided in Section 1. or willfully fails to comply with these by-laws and other requirements, or willfully obstructs the purposes and proper activities of the corporation, the corporation, through the board of directors, may elect to terminate his membership upon tender to him or his heirs or legal representatives the membership deposit paid by the member less any indebtedness then due from him to the corporation. Any member whose membership is so terminated for cause other than that of ceasing to be eligible may appeal from the action of the board of directors to a vote of the members at the next regular meeting of the members or a special meeting of the members called for such purpose.

## Article VI MEMBERSHIP CERTIFICATES

Section 1. This corporation shall not have capital stock. A roster of members admitted pursuant to Article V shall be maintained at the Corporate office.

Section 2. Upon acceptance into the corporation each member is deemed to have accepted the conditions and restrictions stipulated in the articles of incorporation and by-laws and any amendments to the by-laws.

A. A member may transfer their rights in the corporation only upon the books of the corporation and only to persons eligible to become members with the approval of the board of directors and only when the member transferring is free from indebtedness to the corporation.

- B. No member of this corporation shall be entitled to more than one vote at meeting of the members. Every member upon becoming a member of this corporation agrees to sign such agreement for the purchase of water from the corporation as may from time to time be provided and required by the corporation.
- Section 3. All transfers of membership shall be made upon the books of the corporation by the holders thereof or by their legal representative but only with approval of the board of directors and only to persons eligible to become members and only when the transferring member is free from indebtedness to the corporation.

Section 4. Each member agrees to sign such water user's agreements as the corporation shall from time to time provide and require.

## Article VII MEETINGS OF MEMBERS

- Section 1. The Annual meeting of the members of this corporation shall be held at the Kirksville Community Center, unless otherwise advertised in notice, at 7:00 p.m., on the the third Thursday in September of each year, if not a legal holiday, or if a legal holiday, on the next business day following. The Board of Directors retains the right to reschedule the meeting date, time and location provided adequate notice is provided to the members.
- Section 2. Notice of meetings of members of the corporation may be given by a notice mailed to each member of record, directed to the address shown upon the books of the corporation, at least ten days prior to the meeting, or by one publication of notice in a newspaper of general circulation in Madison County, Kentucky. Such a notice shall state the nature, time, place and purpose of the meeting, but no failure or irregularity of notice of any annual meeting, regularly held, shall affect any proceedings taken thereof.
- Section 3. The members present at any meeting of members shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the corporation for the transaction of business. The voting powers of the members of this corporation shall be equal, each member shall have one vote only, and voting by proxy shall be allowed.
- Section 4. Directors of this corporation shall be elected at the annual meeting of the members.
- Section 5. The order of business at the regular meetings and so far as possible at all other meetings shall be:
  - 1. Calling to order and proof of quorum.

- 2. Proof of notice of meeting.
- 3. Reading and action on any unapproved minutes.
- 4. Reports of officers and committees.
- 5. Election of directors.
- 6. Unfinished business.
- 7. New business.
- 8. Adjournment.

## Article VIII DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS

Section 1. The board of directors of this corporation shall consist of five members, all of whom shall be members of the corporation. The directors named in the Articles of Incorporation shall serve until the first annual meeting of the members and until their successors are elected and have qualified. At the first annual meeting of the members, one director shall be elected for a term of one year; two directors for a term of two years; and two directors for a term of three years. At each annual meeting thereafter, the members shall elect for a term of three years the number directors whose terms of office have expired.

Section 2. The board of directors shall meet at the next regularly scheduled meeting after the annual election of directors and shall elect by ballot a president and vice-president from among themselves, a secretary and a treasurer, each of whom shall hold office until the next annual meeting and until the election and qualification of his successors unless sooner removed by death, resignation or for cause.

Section 3. Special meeting of the board of directors may be called at any time by the president, or any two directors, on not less than twenty-four hours notice previous to the meeting. Notice of special meeting of the board of directors shall be given as provided in Article VII, Section 2 of these bylaws. Any meeting at which all directors are present shall be legal without notice or waiver. Any director or officer may waive any notice required to be given under these bylaws. Presence of a director in person shall constitute waiver by him of notice of a director's meeting.

Section 4. If the office of any director becomes vacant by reason of death, resignation, retirement, disqualification or otherwise, except by removal from office, a majority of the remained directors through not less than a quorum shall, by a majority vote, choose a successor who shall hold office until the next annual meeting of the members of the corporation, at which time the members shall elect a director for the unexpired term or terms.

Section 5. A majority of the board of directors shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the board.

Section 6. Compensation of the officers will be fixed by the board of directors of the corporation.

Section 7. Officers and directors may be removed from office in the following manner: Any member, officer or director may present charges against a director or officer by the filing them in writing with the secretary of the corporation. If presented by a member, the charges must be accompanied by a petition signed by ten percent of the members of the corporation. Such removal shall be voted at the next regular meeting or special meeting of the members and shall be effective if approved by a vote of a majority of the members. The director or officer against whom such charges have been presented shall be informed, in writing, of such charges five days prior to the meeting, and shall have the opportunity at such meeting to be heard in person or by counsel and to present witnesses; and the person or persons presenting such charges against him shall have the same opportunity. If the removal of a director is approved. such action shall also vacate any other office held by the removed director in the association. A vacancy in the board thus created shall immediately be filled by a vote of majority of the members present and voting at such meeting. A vacancy in any office thus created shall be filled by the directors from among their number so constituted after the vacancy in the board has been filled.

Section 8. Any member seeking nomination to the Board of Directors shall submit their name at least 60 days prior to the annual meeting. The corporation shall then create ballots for the membership to use to elect the new directors at the annual meeting. The corporation shall notify the membership by a notice mailed to each member 90 days before the annual meeting of the requirement to submit nominations 60 days prior to the annual meeting.

## Article IX DUTIES OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The board of directors, subject to the restriction of law, the articles of incorporation, or these by-laws shall exercise all of the powers of the corporation, and without prejudice to or limitation upon their general powers, it is hereby expressly provided that the board of directors shall have, and hereby are given, full power and authority in respect to the matters and as hereinafter set forth;

- A. To pass upon the qualifications of members.
- B. To select and appoint all officers, agents or employees of the corporation or remove such agents or employees of the corporation for just cause, prescribe such duties and designate such powers as may not be inconsistent with these by-laws, fix their compensation and pay for faithful services.

- C. To borrow from any source, money, goods or services and to make and issue notes and other negotiable and transferable instruments, mortgages, deeds of trust and trust agreements and to do every act and thing necessary to effectuate the same.
- D. To prescribe, adopt and amend, from time to time, such equitable uniform rules and regulations as, in their discretion, may be deemed essential or convenient for the conduct of the business and affairs of the corporation and the guidance and control of its officers and employees, and to prescribe adequate penalties for the breach thereof.
- E. To order, at least once a year, an audit of the books and accounts of the corporation by a qualified auditor or accountant. The report prepared by such auditor or accountant shall be submitted to the directors of the corporation within three months of the close of the fiscal year. The members of the corporation may request a copy of the report.
- F. To fix the charges to be paid by each member for services rendered by the corporation to him, the time of payment and manner of collection.
- G. To require all officers, agents, and employees charged with the responsibility for the custody of any of the funds of the corporation to give adequate bonds, the cost thereof to be paid by the corporation and it shall be mandatory upon the director to so require.
- H. To select one or more banks to act as depositories of the funds of the corporation and to determine the manner of receiving, depositing and disbursing of funds of the corporation and the form of checks and the person or persons by whom the same shall be signed, with the power to change such banks and the person or persons signing such checks and the form thereof at will.

## Article X DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. Duties of the President: The President shall preside over all meetings of the corporation and the board of directors, call special meetings of the board of directors, perform all acts and duties usually performed by an

executive and presiding officer and sign all membership certificates and such other papers of the corporation as he may be authorized or directed to sign by the board of directors, provided the board of directors may authorize any person to sign any or all checks, contracts and other instruments in writing on behalf of the corporation. The President shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the board of directors.

Section 2. Duties of the Vice-President: In the absence or disability of the President, the Vice-President shall perform the duties of the president; provided, however, that in case of death, resignation or disability of the President, the board of directors may declare the office vacant, and elect his successor.

Section 3. Duties of the Secretary and Treasurer: The Secretary shall keep complete records of all meetings of the corporation and the board of directors and shall have general charge and supervision of the books and records of the corporation and such other papers pertaining to the corporation as he may be authorized or directed to do so by the board of directors. The Treasurer shall provide a fidelity bond in an amount to cover an amount equal to the largest sum of money in his possession as Treasurer at any one time. The Secretary shall serve all notices required by law and these by-laws and shall and shall make a full report al all matters and business pertaining to his office to the members at the annual meeting. He shall keep the corporate seal and affix said corporate seal to all papers requiring seal. Both Secretary and Treasurer shall make all reports required by law and shall perform such other duties as may be required by law and shall perform other duties as may be required by him by the corporation or the board of directors. Upon the election of a successor, the Secretary and Treasurer shall turn over to him all books and other property belonging to the corporation that he may have in his possession. The Treasurer shall also perform such duties with respect to the finances of the corporation as may be prescribed by the board of directors.

## Article XI BENEFITS AND DUTIES OF MEMBERS

Section 1. The corporation will install, maintain and operate a main distribution pipeline or lines from the source of the water supply and service lines from the main distribution pipeline or lines to the property line of each member of the corporation, at which points, designated as delivery points, meters to be installed, owned and maintained by the corporation shall be placed. The cost of the service line or lines from the main distribution pipeline or lines of the corporation to the property line of each member shall be paid by the member. The costs will be in accordance with current approved charges as filed with the Public Service Commission. The corporation will also install a cut-off valve in each service line from its main distribution line or lines, shall cut-off valve to be owned and maintained by the corporation and to be installed on some portion of

the service line owned by the corporation. The corporation shall have sole and exclusive right to use cut-off valve to turn it on and off.

Section 2. Each member shall be entitled to not to exceed one service line from the corporation's water system, provided that the member shall be required to pay the applicable charges for each service line in excess of one. No new service line or change in an existing service line may be made which will interfere with an existing service line or the deliver of water therein. Each service line shall connect with the corporation's water system at the nearest available place to the place of desired use by the member if the corporation's water system shall be of sufficient capacity to permit the delivery of water through a service line at that place without interfering with the delivery of water through a prior service line. If the corporation's water system shall be inadequate to permit the delivery of water through a service line installed as such place without interfering with the delivery of water through a prior service line, then such service line shall be installed at such place designated by the corporation. Each member will be required to dig or have dug a ditch for the connection of the service line or lines from the property line of the member to his dwelling or other portion of his premises and will also be required to purchase and install the portion of the service line or lines from his property line to the place of use on his premises and to maintain such portion of such service line or lines which shall be owned by the member at his own expense, provided that the corporation may, if the board of directors so determine, purchase the pipe for and install such portion of such service line or lines, the cost of which will, however, be paid by he individual members.

Section 3. Each member shall be entitled to purchase from the corporation pursuant to such agreements as may from time to time be provided and required by the corporation, such water for domestic, livestock and other purposes as a member may desire, subject, however, to the provisions of these by-laws and to such rules and regulations as may be prescribed by the board of directors, each member shall be entitled to have delivered to him through a single service line only such water as may be necessary to supply the needs of the persons residing in a single dwelling and of the livestock owned by such persons and for such other purposes as needed. The water delivered through each service line shall be metered and the charges for such water shall be determined separately, irrespective of the number of service liens owned by a member. Because the price of materials fluctuate, an offer to supply water to a member will remain open for ninety (90) days. Once the ninety (90) days expires, and if a member still desires water, the Board will recalculate the cost of the project and inform the member of the new cost.

Section 4. In the event the total water supply shall be insufficient to meet all of the needs of the member or in the event there is a shortage of water, the corporation may pro-rate the water available among the various members on such basis as is deemed equitable by the board of directors and may also, prescribe a schedule of hours covering use of water by particular members and

require adherence thereto or prohibit the use of water for other purposes; provided that if at any time the total water supply shall be insufficient to meet all of the needs of all of the members for domestic, livestock and other purposes, the corporation must first satisfy all the needs of all of the members for domestic purposes before supplying any water for other purposes.

Section 5. The board of directors shall have the right in any calendar year to determine the flat minimum monthly rate to be charged each member for a specified quantity of water, such flat minimum monthly rate to be payable irrespective of whether any water is used by a member during any month and the amount of additional charges, if any, for additional water which may be supplied to the members, shall fix the date for payment of such charges, and shall notify each member of the amount of such charges and the dates for payment thereof, a member to be entitled to the deliver of water shall pay such charges at the office of the corporation at or prior to the dates fixed by the board of directors. The failure to pay water charges duly imposed shall result in the automatic imposition of the following penalties:

- A. Non-payment before or on the due date will be subject to a penalty of ten percent of the delinquent account.
- B. Non-payment within twenty days of the mailing date of the original bill will result in the water being shut off from the member's property. A written notice will be mailed at least forty-eight hours prior to shut off date.
- C. Non-payment for sixty days after original due date will allow the corporation, in addition to all other rights and remedies to purchase the member's membership certificate and terminate his membership, and in such event the member shall not be entitled to receive, nor the corporation obligated, to supply any water.
- D. In the event it becomes necessary for the corporation to shut off the water from a member's property, a fee will be charged for the reconnection of the service, and the member will also be required to pay all delinquent accounts and the original deposit paid by the member may be increased, unless the board of directors otherwise agree in writing.

Section 6. The board of directors shall be authorized to require each member to enter into water user's agreements which shall embody the principles set forth in the foregoing sections of this article.

Section 7. Membership may be cancelled and/or water service discontinued by the corporation for any violation of any rule, regulation, or condition of service and especially for any of the following reasons:

- A. Misrepresentation in application as to the property or fixtures to be supplied or use to be made of the water.
- B. Resale or giving away of water. Water tank sales may be granted at the discretion of the board of directors.
- C. Waste or misuse of water due to improper or imperfect service pipes and/or fixtures or failure to keep the same in suitable state of repair.
- D. Tampering with meter, meter seal, service, or valves or permitting such tampering by others.
- E. Connection, cross-connections, or permitting the same, of any separate water supply to the premises which receives water from the corporation.

Section 8. The foregoing sections concerning water charges, reconnection fees, and other penalties are to be enforced in accordance with current Public Service Commission approved rates and regulations for the Association.

## Article XII DISTRIBUTION OF SURPLUS FUNDS

Section 1. It is not anticipated that there will be any net income. If there should be any, then at the end of the fiscal year, after paying the expenses of the corporation for operation and otherwise, and after setting aside reserve, and such other reserves as the board of directors may deem proper and after providing for payments on interest and principal of obligations and amortized debts of the corporation, and after providing for the purchase of proper supplies and equipment, the net earning shall be accumulated in a surplus fund for the purpose of replacing, enlarging, extending and repairing the system and property of the corporation and for such other purposes as the board of directors may determine to be for the best interests of the corporation. The said surplus fund or any portion thereof may from time to time at the discretion of the board of directors be applied to said debt of said corporation.

Section 2. Any part or the whole of such net income may be credited at the discretion of the board of directors to the indebtedness of the corporation, should any exist, and upon payment of all debts of the corporation, any surplus remaining to be placed in a reserve account until such time as the board of directors shall deem sufficient for the needs of such corporation. Thereafter, the board of directors may reduce said water rates to meet the cost of operation only.

Article XIII
AMENDMENTS

These by-laws may be repealed or amended by a vote of a majority of the directors present at any regular meeting of the corporation, or at any special meeting of the corporation called for that purpose, except that the directors shall not have the power to change the purposes of the corporation so as to decrease its rights and powers under the laws of the state, or to waive any requirement of bond or other provision for the safety and security of the property and funds of the corporation or its members, or to deprive any members of rights and privileges then existing, or so to amend the by-laws as to effect a fundamental change in the policies of the corporation. Notice of any amendments to be made at a special meeting of the directors must be given according to Article VII, Section 2.

Amendments to these by-laws must, and will have, prior approval of the lending institution, if an indebtedness is owed or outstanding, before they become effective.

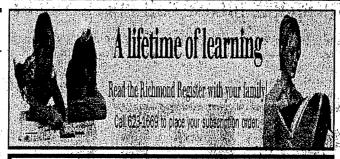

#### Response to 807 KAR 5:011: Section 10(1)(a)

Kirksville Water Association (KWA) began offering the option of paying bills by credit cards to our customers in December 2007. This service started as a result of multiple requests by customers to have this option as a convenience to them. The \$2.00 fee in question was a fee charged to us by the credit card companies and passed on to the customer. It created no additional revenue for KWA. Based on this reason, we did not submit for approval of this fee to the PSC. I take full responsibility for this matter and would like to resolve this as soon as possible.

#### Response to 807 KAR 5:011: Section 10(1)(d)

In regards to the impact of this case to KWA customers, after reviewing the justification submitted to PSC, I hope that you will consider a flat fee of \$2.00 per transaction to be fair to all KWA that choose to use this service.

In addition to Case No. 2009-00315, I am submitting information concerning a bank draft fee of .15 per transaction for review by your office. Included you will find a customer authorization form, transaction charges from our bank and a recent year of bank draft history for the KWA customers, who choose to use this service. This fee does not create any additional revenue for KWA. Please consider this fee for approval.

I thank you for your time and hope that we can resolve these matters soon. Copies of my response to the deficiencies for this case and for the request for the .15 bank draft fee approval have been sent to the Attorney General's Office.
