## PETITION OF KENTUCKY UTILITIES COMPANY FOR CONFIDENTIAL PROTECTION

Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU") hereby petitions the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("Commission") pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 7, and KRS 61.878(1)(a) to grant confidential protection for the items described herein, which KU has provided in support of its Answer to the Complaint filed in this proceeding. In support of this Petition, KU states as follows:

- 1. The Kentucky Open Records Act exempts from disclosure certain information of a personal nature where public disclosure would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. KRS 61.878(1)(a).
- 2. In its Answer filed in response to the Complaint in this proceeding, KU attached as Exhibit A copies of Complainant's bills for electric utility service. This information contains the customer's account number and merits confidential protection because KU believes that revealing their contents in the public record could result in an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

3. If the Commission disagrees with this request for confidential protection,

however, it must hold an evidentiary hearing (a) to protect KU's due process rights and (b) to

supply the Commission with a complete record to enable it to reach a decision with regard to this

matter. Utility Regulatory Commission v. Kentucky Water Service Company, Inc., Ky. App.,

642 S.W.2d 591, 592-94 (1982).

4. KU will disclose the confidential documents, pursuant to a protective agreement,

to intervenors and others with a legitimate interest in this information and as required by the

Commission. In accordance with the provisions of 807 KAR 5:001 Section 7, the Applicants

herewith file with the Commission one copy of the above-discussed documents on yellow paper

and ten (10) copies of its response without the confidential documents were already filed with

the Commission on November 4, 2009.

WHEREFORE, Kentucky Utilities Company respectfully requests that the Commission

grant confidential protection for the information at issue, or in the alternative, schedule an

evidentiary hearing on all factual issues while maintaining the confidentiality of the information

pending the outcome of the hearing.
