Dear Sir or Madam:

I understand the need of any corporate endeavor to increase prices occasionally in order to meet rising costs. However, excepting the oil companies, which made billions last year, I don't know of a corporate entity that raised it prices 35% last year and is still in business. I think I understand that the providers of electricity have a monopoly and are spared the need to compete for business; for if they had to compete for customers, they might do the same thing other businesses have done during these tough economical times . . .cut expenses, get rid of deadwood, and increase productivity.

Further, excepting of our tax payer bailed out financial institutions' employees, I don't know of anyone who received a thirty-five percent (35%) wage increase this past year or aggregately for the past five or more years! How can we pay for this increase if you permit it?!!
