Dear Commissioners and Others Whom It May Concern:

LANDOWNER CONCERN AND REQUEST FOR INTERVENTION REGARDING CASE NUMBER 2010-00015.

As a landowner located next door to the proposed site, we are concerned about the construction, operation and location of the proposed new wireless telecommunications facility located at 3950 Lexington Road, Versailles, Kentucky, 40383.

Why is another cell tower needed when one is located about 1 1/2 miles away on Bluegrass Parkway?

Where specifically is the tower to be located on this small piece of land and where will the "related ground facilities" be located?

How much additional lighting will be needed at night around the tower and ground facilities? We have livestock and live on agriculturally zoned land.

Aesthetically this will not enhance a visitor's entrance into Woodford County, which also includes the Nationally-registered Pisgah Historic District that begins on Pisgah Pike.

Cellular phone towers are a relatively new technology and full information on health effects are not known. In particular, not enough time has elapsed to permit epidemiologic studies.

Will measurements of Radio frequencies near the cell tower and/or base station be tested so they do not exceed recommended limits? Two towers (cell and radio station) will be emitting radio frequencies? Will testing address the output of both? What testing and results of similar situations can be provided to the public and commission?
