Dear Judge Mattingly:

We are legal counsel to Kentucky RSA #4 Cellular General Partnership d/b/a Bluegrass Cellular ("Kentucky RSA #4"). In that capacity, we are responding to your letter dated March 15, 2010, addressed to the Public Service Commission of the Commonwealth of Kentucky (the "Commission") regarding your concerns with respect to the proposed construction of a cell tower facility to be located at 5210 Highway 1157, Lebanon, Kentucky, 40033.

As discussed in your recent telephone call on Thursday, March 25, 2010 with Jeff Brewer, the Wireless Network Project Manager for Kentucky RSA #4, and Kerry Ingle, a paralegal with this law firm, Kentucky RSA #4, at this time, has decided not to go any further in the approval process of its application for the proposed Bradfordsville cell site, at its current location.

Kentucky RSA #4 is researching its options for an alternate location for the Bradfordsville cell site. This process is extensive and may take up to 60 days, or longer, to find another viable and suitable location.

During this timeframe, Kentucky RSA #4 will notify the Commission of its intentions and request that its current application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity be held in abeyance.
