RE: Case No. 2010-00076 Application of Kentucky Frontier Gas, LLC for Approval of Transfer of Cow Creek Gas, Inc., Dema Gas Co., Inc., and Farm Tap Customers

On March 30, 2010, an informal conference was held with Commission Staff ("Staff"), Kentucky Frontier Gas Company, LLC ("Kentucky Frontier") and Industrial Gas Services, Inc. ("IGS") pursuant to the notice of March 26, 2010. Those in attendance in person and by telephone are shown on the attached sign-in sheet.

Both Staff and Kentucky Frontier consulted and referenced the maps filed herein as Exhibit 6 of the application of Kentucky Frontier. It was the intent of Staff to clarify any questions Kentucky Frontier may have concerning the questions contained in the data request of March 26, 2010 so that Kentucky Frontier may submit complete answers to the questions.

A general discussion was held about the 10.1 miles of pipeline now owned by DLR Enterprises, Inc. to be acquired by IGS via a stock transfer. Staff had questions as to why Kentucky Frontier is not acquiring the 10.1 miles of pipeline and the status of the customers now being served by the line. Staff expressed to Kentucky Frontier their concern about the division of the customers and the ownership of the pipeline along the 10-mile section. Kentucky Frontier assured Staff that it would consider those to be distribution customers and would treat them as such, affording them more rights than farm tap customers.

Commission Staff and Kentucky Frontier discussed each question contained in the data request. Staff was satisfied that Kentucky Frontier understood each question and would be able to respond.

It was further understood that some of the system or location maps requested could not be furnished in this case but would be addressed after any transfer was approved.

There being nothing further to discuss, the informal conference was adjourned.
