The presentation contains actual comments and suggestions from a Division of Water inspector attempting to motivate and educate water and wastewater operators. The session will point out some right and wrong ways of record keeping, daily functions, and reporting practices. The presentation will demonstrate the importance of good housekeeping practices and the ability to perform tasks and retrieve data upon request. Attendees will learn the importance of a professional attitude and the desire to produce quality product and service.

Clem Wethington

Kentucky Rural Water Association

Clem Wethington, Education Director, came to Kentucky Rural Water Association in 1987 from the City of Eddyville where he was Superintendent of Public Works for over eight years. For nine years he served on the Eddyville City Council. Clem holds a Class IIIA Kentucky Water Treatment Plant Operator's License, a Class II Kentucky Water Distribution System Operator's License, and previously held a Class I Kentucky Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator's License.

Since joining KRWA in 1987, Mr. Wethington has held many positions of responsibility. As a Circuit Rider, his primary duties were to provide technical assistance and hands-on training to rural water utility personnel throughout Kentucky. As a Groundwater Technician, he worked with communities throughout the Commonwealth to help develop local wellhead protection plans. In his position of Program Specialist, he was dually responsible for providing training and technical assistance to water systems. Mr. Wethington was also a contributing author of a Rural and Small System Training Guide entitled "An Introduction to Hydrant Operation and Maintenance" published by the National Rural Water Association (NRWA) in 1989. Over the years, NRWA has honored Clem with the distinctions of Rookie Circuit Rider of the Year, Groundwater Technician of the Year and Training Specialist of the Year.
