Dear Mr. Derouen:

Pursuant to the Kentucky Public Service Commission's Order entered August 4, 2010, in the above-referenced case, Cricket Communications, Inc. ("Cricket") and BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. d/b/a AT&T Kentucky ("AT&T Kentucky") submit this joint report indicating that the Parties have reached an agreement in principle that resolves the disagreement that is the subject of the above-referenced arbitration, as well as similar disagreements pending in other AT&T states.

The Parties are and have been, since July 26 when they filed their joint motion to hold the case in abeyance, in the process of drafting and executing amendments to their existing Interconnection Agreements ("ICAs") as well as language for successor ICAs in many of those states. The process of finalizing the ICAs is taking longer than originally anticipated. While Cricket and AT&T Kentucky are in the final stages of reviewing the voluminous documents exchanged between the Parties, and are very close to finalizing the required documents to file in each of the states involved, the Parties need more time to finalize those documents.

Based on the foregoing, Cricket and AT&T Kentucky respectfully request that the Commission continue to hold this case in abeyance until October 18, 2010, at which time the parties expect to have an agreement in place to file for approval by the Commission.

I have been authorized by Cricket's counsel to state that Cricket concurs in this report.
