**Proposed Construction** 

Pursuant to the Commission Staff's request, a telephonic informal conference was held on September 1, 2011. Attending the conference were Don Combs of Grayson Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation ("Grayson") and the following Commission Staff members: Quang Nguyen, Elie Russell, and Chris Whelan. The purpose of the conference was to ascertain when Grayson began implementation of the upgrade from a Turtle 1 system to a Turtle 2 system. The Grayson representative indicated that the cooperative commenced implementation of the Turtle 2 upgrade in early 2010, around the January or February time frame. The initial upgrade was to seven substations in anticipation of Grayson filing its application for certain optional rate schedules (i.e., inclining block rates and time-of-day tariffs).

There being no further discussions, the conference was adjourned.
