Dear Mr. Derouen:

In preparing the responses to the Hearing Data Requests, and further considering my testimony at the March 22, 2011 hearing, I want to expand upon an answer I gave at the hearing. Vice-Chairman Gardner asked if Kentucky Power Company's generating resources were sufficient to allow it to meet its load. In response, I noted that Kentucky Power had available both its Big Sandy generation as well as the capacity available to it under the Rockport Unit Power Agreement. Omitted from my answer was the fact that the AEP System - East Zone, of which Kentucky Power is a member, is planned, constructed and operated as an integrated power system. Whenever a member company's generating capability is insufficient to supply its demand, it draws upon the resources of the other AEP-East Zone companies in accordance with the provisions of the Interconnection Agreement.
