The other names listed on the plat are land owners with no homes in the immediate area, with the exception of the people who will benefit financially from the tower. Therefore, we understand that we may be the only ones to object, however one should be enough to at least re-evaluate.

Please advise us of anything we can possibly do to stop this tower from being erected.
