Pursuant to the Kentucky Public Service Commission's Rules Governing Tariffs effective August 4, 1984, I hereby certify that I am Lonnie E. Bellar, Vice President, State Regulation and Rates for Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU" or "Company"), a utility furnishing retail electric service within the Commonwealth of Kentucky which, on the 1st day of June, 2011, filed an application to issue an order granting KU Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity for the construction of baghouses with powdered activated carbon injection and lime injection systems at all Brown and Ghent Units, and approving an amended compliance plan for purposes of recovering the costs of new pollution control facilities through its Rate Schedule ECR as required by KRS 278.183, and as applicable KRS 278,020(1). Notice to the public of the filing of the application has been completed in substantial compliance with Section 8 of 807 KAR 5:011 as follows:

That more than twenty (20) customers will be affected by said change by way of an increase in their bills, and that on the 13th day of May, 2011, there was delivered to the Kentucky Press Association, an agency that acts on behalf of newspapers of general circulation throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky in which customers affected reside, for publication

in such newspapers once a week for three consecutive weeks beginning the week of May 25, 2011, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:011, Section 8(2)(c), a notice of the filing of KU's Application in this case. Publication of this notice is now complete, though certain deviations occurred for which KU is petitioning the Commission today for deviation under 807 KAR 5:011, Section 14. Affidavits from the Kentucky Press Association confirming this publication and a copy of said notice are enclosed in the envelope marked Exhibit A. The Kentucky Press Association has presented to KU proof of this publication of notice in the form of "tear sheets," which KU will maintain in its files.

On the 1st day of June, 2011, notice was exhibited for public inspection at the offices and places of business of the Company in the territory affected thereby, including its main office, to wit, at the places listed on Exhibit B, and that the same will be kept open to public inspection at said offices and places of business in conformity with the requirements of 807 KAR 5:011, Section 8.

I further certify that KU included a general statement explaining the Application in this case with the bills for all Kentucky retail customers during the course of their regular monthly billing cycle beginning on May 31, 2011. An accurate copy of this general statement is marked as Exhibit C and attached hereto.

NOTICE TO CUSTOMERS OF KENTUCKY UTILITIES COMPANY

RECOVERY BY ENVIRONMENTAL SURCHARGE OF KENTUCKY UTILITIES COMPANY'S 2011 ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE PLAN

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that on June 1, 2011, Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU") will file with the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("Commission") in Case No. 2011-00161, an Application pursuant to Kentucky Revised Statute 278.183 for approval of an amended compliance plan ("KU's 2011 Environmental Compliance Plan") for the purpose of recovering the capital costs and operation and maintenance costs associated with new pollution control facilities through an increase in the environmental surcharge on customers' bills beginning January 31, 2012 under KU's existing Electric Rate Schedule ECR, also known as the environmental cost recovery surcharge.

Federal, state, and local environmental regulations require KU to build and upgrade equipment and facilities to operate in an environmentally sound manner. Specifically, KU is seeking Commission approval of Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CPCN") to construct new Particulate Matter Control Systems to serve all units at the Ghent Generating Station in Ghent, Kentucky, and to serve all units at the E.W. Brown Generating Station in Burgin, Kentucky, to comply with the national emissions standards for hazardous air pollutants proposed by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA"). The Particulate Matter Control Systems are also being installed to comply with EPA-imposed sulfuric acid mist and opacity requirements. Additionally, KU is seeking recovery of costs associated with these environmental projects, which are necessary for compliance with the federal Clean Air Act, the federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, and other current or proposed environmental laws and regulations, and enforcement actions. These additional projects primarily relate to installing Particulate Matter Control Systems to serve all units at the Ghent Generating Station, installing Particulate Matter Control Systems to serve all units at the E.W. Brown Generating Station, converting the main coal combustion residuals treatment basin at the E.W. Brown Generating Station to a landfill and other pollution control facilities. The capital cost of the new pollution control facilities for which KU is seeking recovery at this time is estimated to be \$1.1 billion. Additional operation and maintenance expenses will be incurred for these projects and are costs that KU is requesting to recover through the environmental surcharge in its application.

The impact on KU's customers is estimated to be a 1.5% increase in 2012 with a maximum increase of 12.2% in 2016. For a KU residential customer using 1,000 kilowatt hours per month, the initial monthly increase is expected to be \$1.13 during 2012, with the maximum monthly increase expected to be \$9.46 during 2016.

The Environmental Surcharge Application described in this Notice is proposed by KU. However, the Public Service Commission may issue an order modifying or denying KU's Environmental Surcharge Application. Such action may result in an environmental surcharge for consumers other than the environmental surcharge described in this Notice.

Any corporation, association, body politic or person may, by motion within thirty (30) days after publication, request leave to intervene in Case No. 2011-00161. That

motion shall be submitted to the Public Service Commission, 211 Sower Blvd., P.O. Box 615, Frankfort, Kentucky, 40602, and shall set forth the grounds for the request including the status and interest of the party. Intervenors may obtain copies of the Application and testimony by contacting Kentucky Utilities Company at 220 West Main Street, Louisville, Kentucky, 40202, Attention: Lonnie E. Bellar, Vice President, State Regulation and Rates. A copy of the Application and testimony will be available for public inspection on KU's website (http://www.lge-ku.com) and at KU's offices where bills are paid after June 1, 2011.

RECOVERY BY ENVIRONMENTAL SURCHARGE OF KENTUCKY UTILITIES COMPANY'S 2011 ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE PLAN

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that on June 1, 2011, Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU") filed with the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("Commission") in Case No. 2011-00161, an Application pursuant to Kentucky Revised Statute 278.183 for approval of an amended compliance plan ("KU's 2011 Environmental Compliance Plan") for the purpose of recovering the capital costs and operation and maintenance costs associated with new pollution control facilities through an increase in the environmental surcharge on customers' bills beginning January 31, 2012 under KU's existing Electric Rate Schedule ECR, also known as the environmental cost recovery surcharge.

Federal, state, and local environmental regulations require KU to build and upgrade equipment and facilities to operate in an environmentally sound manner. Specifically, KU is seeking Commission approval of Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CPCN") to construct new Particulate Matter Control Systems to serve all units at the Ghent Generating Station in Ghent, Kentucky, and to serve all units at the E.W. Brown Generating Station in Burgin, Kentucky, to comply with the national emissions standards for hazardous air pollutants proposed by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA"). The Particulate Matter Control Systems are also being installed to comply with EPA-imposed sulfuric acid mist and opacity requirements. Additionally, KU is seeking recovery of costs associated with these environmental projects, which are necessary for compliance with the federal Clean Air Act, the federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, and other current or proposed environmental laws and regulations, and enforcement actions. These additional projects primarily relate to installing Particulate Matter Control Systems to serve all units at the Ghent Generating Station, installing Particulate Matter Control Systems to serve all units at the E.W. Brown Generating Station, converting the main coal combustion residuals treatment basin at the E.W. Brown Generating Station to a landfill and other pollution control facilities. The capital cost of the new pollution control facilities for which KU is seeking recovery at this time is estimated to be \$1.1 billion. Additional operation and maintenance expenses will be incurred for these projects and are costs that KU is requesting to recover through the environmental surcharge in its application.

The impact on KU's customers is estimated to be a 1.5% increase in 2012 with a maximum increase of 12.2% in 2016. For a KU residential customer using 1,000 kilowatt hours per month, the initial monthly increase is expected to be \$1.13 during 2012, with the maximum monthly increase expected to be \$9.46 during 2016.

The Environmental Surcharge Application described in this Notice is proposed by KU. However, the Public Service Commission may issue an order modifying or denying KU's Environmental Surcharge Application. Such action may result in an environmental surcharge for consumers other than the environmental surcharge described in this Notice.

Any corporation, association, body politic or person may, by motion within thirty (30) days after publication, request leave to intervene in Case No. 2011-00161. That

motion shall be submitted to the Public Service Commission, 211 Sower Blvd., P.O. Box 615, Frankfort, Kentucky, 40602, and shall set forth the grounds for the request including the status and interest of the party. Intervenors may obtain copies of the Application and testimony by contacting Kentucky Utilities Company at 220 West Main Street, Louisville, Kentucky, 40202, Attention: Lonnie E. Bellar, Vice President, State Regulation and Rates. Copy of the General Statement Included In Customers' Bills During the Course Of Their Regular Monthly Billing Cycle Beginning On May 31, 2011

Dear KU Customer:

To comply with existing and new federal environmental laws and regulations, KU must continue to invest in additional pollution control facilities. Currently, KU is seeking Kentucky Public Service Commission ("KPSC") approval to build additional pollution control facilities. Following KPSC approval, the actual costs associated with the pollution control facilities would be passed on to retail customers through the existing Environmental Surcharge billing factor. KU estimates that the initial impact would be an increase in the environmental surcharge of \$1.13 per month for a residential customer using 1,000 kilowatt hours (kWh) per month. The announcement below is included to comply with KPSC regulations regarding notice of tariff changes to customers. If approved as filed, this change in rates will be included on customer bills no sooner than January 31, 2012.

NOTICE TO CUSTOMERS OF KENTUCKY UTILITIES COMPANY

RECOVERY BY ENVIRONMENTAL SURCHARGE OF KENTUCKY UTILITIES COMPANY'S 2011 ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE PLAN

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that on June 1, 2011, Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU") will file with the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("Commission") in Case No. 2011-00161, an Application pursuant to Kentucky Revised Statute 278.183 for approval of an amended compliance plan ("KU's 2011 Environmental Compliance Plan") for the purpose of recovering the capital costs and operation and maintenance costs associated with new pollution control facilities through an increase in the environmental surcharge on customers' bills beginning January 31, 2012 under KU's existing Electric Rate Schedule ECR, also known as the environmental cost recovery surcharge.

Federal, state, and local environmental regulations require KU to build and upgrade equipment and facilities to operate in an environmentally sound manner. Specifically, KU is seeking Commission approval of Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CPCN") to construct new Particulate Matter Control Systems to serve all units at the Ghent Generating Station in Ghent, Kentucky, and to serve all units at the E.W. Brown Generating Station in Burgin, Kentucky, to comply with the national emissions standards for hazardous air pollutants proposed by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA"). The Particulate Matter Control Systems are also being installed to comply with EPA-imposed sulfuric acid mist and opacity requirements. Additionally, KU is seeking recovery of costs associated with these environmental projects, which are necessary for compliance with the federal Clean Air Act, the federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, and other current or proposed environmental laws and regulations, and enforcement actions. These additional projects primarily relate to installing Particulate Matter Control Systems to serve all units at the Ghent Generating Station, installing Particulate Matter Control Systems to serve all units at the E.W. Brown Generating Station, converting the main coal combustion residuals treatment basin at the E.W. Brown Generating Station to a landfill and other pollution control facilities. The capital cost of the new pollution control facilities for which KU is seeking recovery at this time is estimated to be \$1.1 billion. Additional operation and maintenance expenses will be incurred for these projects and are costs that KU is requesting to recover through the environmental surcharge in its application.

The impact on KU's customers is estimated to be a 1.5% increase in 2012 with a maximum increase of 12.2% in 2016. For a KU residential customer using 1,000 kilowatt hours per month, the initial monthly increase is expected to be \$1.13 during 2012, with the maximum monthly increase expected to be \$9.46 during 2016.

The Environmental Surcharge Application described in this Notice is proposed by KU. However, the Public Service Commission may issue an order modifying or denying KU's Environmental Surcharge Application. Such action may result in an environmental surcharge for consumers other than the environmental surcharge described in this Notice.

Any corporation, association, body politic or person may, by motion within thirty (30) days after publication, request leave to intervene in Case No. 2011-00161. That motion shall be submitted to the Public Service Commission, 211 Sower Blvd., P.O. Box 615, Frankfort, Kentucky, 40602, and shall set forth the grounds for the request including the status and interest of the party. Intervenors may obtain copies of the Application and testimony by contacting Kentucky Utilities Company at 220 West Main Street, Louisville, Kentucky, 40202, Attention: Lonnie E. Bellar, Vice President, State Regulation and Rates. A copy of the Application and testimony will be available for public inspection on KU's website (http://www.lge-ku.com) and at KU's offices where bills are paid after June 1, 2011.

PETITION FOR APPROVAL TO DEVIATE FROM RULE

Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU") petitions the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("Commission") to grant KU approval, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:011, Section 14, to deviate from the notice requirements in the above-captioned proceeding because KU has substantially complied with the Commission's notice regulations. In support of this petition, KU states as follows:

- 1. On May 2, 2011, KU filed its Notice of Intent to file an application seeking approval of an amended environmental compliance plan; a revised surcharge to recover the costs of the amended plan; and Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity pursuant to KRS 278.020(1) for the construction of necessary environmental equipment. KU subsequently filed the application on June 1, 2011.
- 2. On May 13, 2011, KU delivered to the Kentucky Press Service, Inc., an organization that provides legal notice placement services for third-parties with its members, a notice of the filing of its application for publication in newspapers in KU's service area, once a week for three consecutive weeks, with the first publication to be made prior to the filing of KU's application, as required by 807 KAR 5:011, Section 8(2)(c). *See* Certificate of Completed Notice. The Kentucky Press Service, Inc., directed each newspaper in writing to publish the

notice once a week for three consecutive weeks, with the first publication to be made prior to the filing of KU's application, as required by 807 KAR 5:011, Section 8(2)(c). Certain of the newspapers that were to publish notice of the filing of KU's application omitted to publish the notice for the three consecutive weeks KU instructed. As a result, the notice was not published for three consecutive calendar weeks in eight newspapers, and there was a printing issue in an additional newspaper, the *Harlan Daily Enterprise*. With one exception, the publication of the notice occurred in every newspaper prior to the date on which KU filed its Application with the Commission on June 1, 2011.

- 3. KU contacted the Kentucky Press Service, Inc. to ascertain why the newspapers failed to print the notice properly. Unless specifically noted below, the Kentucky Press Service, Inc. indicated that the newspapers had simply overlooked the fact that the notice was to be published for three consecutive weeks, despite having received explicit written and timely instructions regarding same.
- 4. The *Berea Citizen* published the notice as scheduled on May 26, 2011 and June 2, 2011. The newspaper failed to publish the third consecutive notice on June 9, 2011 and June 16, 2011, but did publish the third notice on June 23, 2011. The newspaper indicated that it failed to publish the third consecutive notice because the advertisement representative had a sickness in the family that led to absences from work. The *Richmond Register*, which is a newspaper of larger circulation in Madison County, published the notice correctly.
- 5. The *Brownsville Edmonson News* published the notice as scheduled on May 26, 2011 and June 2, 2011. The newspaper failed to publish the third consecutive notice on June 9, 2011, but published the notice on June 16, 2011.

- 6. The *Leitchfield Record* published the notice as scheduled on May 26, 2011, but failed to publish on June 2, 2011, as scheduled. The newspaper published the second and third notice on June 9, 2011 and June 16, 2011. A second newspaper in Grayson County, the *Leitchfield/Grayson County News Gazette*, published the notice correctly.
- 7. The *Manchester Enterprise* published the notice as scheduled on May 26, 2011, but failed to publish on June 2, 2011 as scheduled. A representative for the newspaper stated that the notice was on the manifest, but somehow did not make it to the printed page. The newspaper published the second and third notice on June 9, 2011 and June 16, 2011.
- 8. The *Owingsville Bath County Outlook* published the notice as scheduled on May 25, 2011 and June 2, 2011 as scheduled. The newspaper failed to publish the third notice on June 9, 2011 as scheduled, but did publish the final notice on June 16, 2011.
- 9. The *Princeton Times Leader* published the notice as scheduled on May 25, 2011 and June 1, 2011. The newspaper failed to publish the third notice as scheduled on June 8, 2011, but did publish the notice on June 15, 2011.
- 10. The *Russell Springs Times* published the notice on May 26, 2011 and June 2, 2011 as scheduled. The newspaper failed to publish as scheduled on June 9, 2011, but did publish the third notice on June 16, 2011.
- 11. The *Smithland Livingston Ledger* published the notice as scheduled on May 25, 2011, but failed to publish as scheduled on June 1, 2011. The newspaper published the second and third notice on June 7, 2011 and June 14, 2011.
- 12. The *Harlan Daily Enterprise* published the notice as scheduled on May 25, 2011, but as noted by a customer, the print was difficult to read. KU immediately responded to the issue by letter, stating in a letter to the Commission that it had requested the newspaper republish

the first notice on May 31, 2011. The newspaper instead republished the first notice on June 1, 2011, which is the date KU filed its application. The *Harlan Daily Enterprise* printed the second and third notice correctly. The *Cumberland Tri-City News*, which also serves Harlan County, published the notice correctly.

- 13. KU's application was ultimately accepted for filing on June 16, 2011, after the Commission granted KU's motion for deviation with regard to the number of paper copies KU provided of the voluminous appendices to certain of KU's witnesses' testimony. Thus, by the time the application was accepted for filing, all but one of the newspapers had published all three notices.
- 14. In addition to causing notice of the filing of its application in this case to be published in newspapers of general circulation in its service areas, KU has posted the notice for public inspection at its office and place of business, as well as on its website. *See* Certificate of Completed Notice. Moreover, KU also included a general statement explaining the application in this case with the bills for all Kentucky retail customers during the course of their regular monthly billing cycle beginning on May 31, 2011. Finally, the two newspapers with the largest circulation in the state, the *Lexington Herald-Leader* and *Louisville Courier-Journal*, not only published the notice correctly but also published articles regarding KU's and Louisville Gas and Electric Company's applications. The applications have received broad coverage in and by other media.
- 15. The purpose of the Commission's regulation is to ensure that the public has sufficient notice of KU's application and to respond accordingly. Despite the deviations noted above, notice was published in each county three times, and that notice was further supplemented by posting at KU's offices and on its website, in addition to including an explanation in retail

customers' bills. KU's substantial compliance with the Commission's regulation has met the

purpose of the notice requirement. As stated by the Kentucky Supreme Court

Substantial compliance in regard to publication requirements has been authorized. The purpose of the statute is to allow the public

an ample opportunity to become sufficiently informed on the

public question involved.1

16. The Commission has authority to permit KU to deviate from the publication

requirements pursuant to 807 KAR 5:011, Section 14.

17. Because KU is in substantial compliance with the publication requirements of 807

KAR 5:011, Section 8(2)(c), good cause exists for the Commission to permit KU to deviate from

the requirement of the regulation and to accept the publication of notice of KU's application as

sufficient.

WHEREFORE, Kentucky Utilities Company respectfully requests that the Commission

grant it approval pursuant to 807 KAR 5:011, Section 14 to deviate from the notice requirements

of 807 KAR 5:011, Section 8(2) and to accept the publication of notice of its application as

sufficient.
