PETITION OF CINCINNATI BELL TELEPHONE COMPANY LLC FOR REVIEW OF A DECISION OF THE POOLING ADMINISTRATOR

Cincinnati Bell Telephone Company LLC ("CBT") hereby requests that the Commission review and overturn a decision of the number Pooling Administrator ("PA"), which denied a CBT request for numbering resources. On April 1, 2011, CBT filed a request with the PA for a thousands-block of numbers (1,000 numbers) to meet a specific customer request that CBT was unable to satisfy with its existing numbering resources. The PA denied CBT's request on the grounds that CBT has not satisfied the months-to-exhaust and utilization criteria established in the Central Office Code Assignment Guidelines. Under the federal numbering rules, a state commission may overturn the PA's decision based on its determination that the carrier has demonstrated a verifiable need for the numbering resources and has exhausted all other available remedies. For the reasons set forth below, CBT submits that the Commission is justified in overturning the PA's decision and granting CBT's request for a new thousands-block.

The Federal Communications Commission ("FCC"), in its Third Report and Order in the Numbering Resource Optimization proceeding, found that "a carrier should be able to get additional numbering resources when there is a verifiable need due to the carrier's inability to satisfy a specific customer request." It also clarified that states may grant requests by carriers in such circumstances, as long as the request is for a customer seeking contiguous blocks of numbers and not vanity numbers. Therefore, this Commission has the authority to overturn the PA's decisions under the appropriate circumstances.

In the immediate case, CBT has a request from Cummins Business Services (see Attachment A) for 100 contiguous numbers that will be compatible with its existing dialing plan. Cummins will use the numbers to accommodate its expanding warehouse operations in Walton, Kentucky. All Cummins sites in North America access outside lines by dialing 8, which means that they cannot use numbers from the 8000 block. In addition, numbers from 3920 through 3999 and 6700 through 6799 cannot be used because they are already used for 2nd line rollovers and paging, respectively.

CBT has reviewed its inventory of numbers available for assignment within the Walton rate center and cannot find 100 contiguous numbers that will satisfy Cummins' requirements. Upon determining that it could not satisfy the customer's request with its existing numbering resources, CBT requested a new thousands-block from the PA; however, the request was rejected because CBT does not meet the months to exhaust and utilization required for assignment of a new thousands block in the Walton rate center.

To further assist the Commission's review, attached is a copy of CBT's request to the PA which includes the MTE and Utilization Certification Worksheet as well as the PA's response (see Attachment B).

For the reasons set forth above, CBT requests that the Commission overturn the PA's decision and direct the PA to grant CBT's request for a thousands-block to satisfy the needs of its customer. Furthermore, CBT requests that the Commission expedite consideration of this request so that the customer can promptly proceed with its expansion.

Cummins is expanding our warehouse in Walton, KY. We will need an additional block of 100 contiguous DID numbers to support this growth.

Our current DID range is 859-426-4920 through 859-426-4999.

Due to our current programming, there are certain numbers that we cannot accommodate. All Cummins sites in North America access outside lines by dialing 8 which means a block that is in the range of 8000 thru 8999 cannot be used.

We also cannot accommodate the range of 3920 through 3999 because we currently use these numbers for our 2^{nd} line rollovers.

We also cannot use any number in the 6700 range due to paging constraints.

We would like to remain within the same prefix if possible.

We are currently in the process of adding additional employees/phones and need these new numbers as soon as possible.



Instructions for filling out each Section of the Part 1A form:

Section 1.1 Contact information requires that Service Providers supply under "Block Applicant" the company name, company headquarters address, a contact within the company, an address where the contact person may be reached, in addition to the correct phone, fax, and e-mail address. The Pooling Administrator section also requires the Service Provider to fill in the Pooling Administrator's name, address, phone, fax and e-mail.

Section 1.2 Service Providers who need a thousands-block assignment or for an Location Routing Number (LRN) are required to fill in this section. If needed for an LRN, a CO Code Application needs to also be submitted to the PA. The Service Provider should supply the Numbering Plan Area (NPA); the Local Access Transport Area (LATA), which is a three-digit number that can be found in the TelcordiaTM LERGTM Routing Guide. The Operating Company Number (OCN) assigned to the service provider and the OCN its parent company. An OCN is a four-character alphanumeric assigned by TelcordiaTM Routing Administration (TRA). In addition, the number of thousands-blocks requested should be supplied. The Switch Identification as well as the city or wire center name, rate center, rate center sub zone, homing tandem and CLLI TM tandem of the facilities based provider XI, Explanations of these terms may be found in the footnotes.

Section 1.3 The date the Service Provider completes the application should be entered in this section, as well as the Effective Date of the requested thousands-block.

Section 1.4 Service Providers should indicate their type, e.g., local exchange carrier, competitive local exchange carrier, interexchange carrier, CMRS. The also indicate the primary type of business in which the numbering resource is to be used. Service Providers also may indicate their preference for a particular thousands-block, e.g., 321-9XXX, or indicate any thousands-blocks that may be undesirable, e.g., 321-6XXX.

Section 1.5 Service Providers indicate the type of request. Initial requests are for first applications for thousands-blocks in a rate center, growth for additional thousands-blocks in a rate center in which the applicant already has numbering resources, and provide the required evidence as ordered by the FCC.

The thousands-block applicant certifies veracity of this form by signing their name, and providing their title and date.

Section 1.6 Service Providers must indicate the updated/current information in regards to contaminated TNs on the block they are returning to the pool. Blocks with over 10% contamination (101 TNs or more) shall not be returned to the pool unless they meet criteria outlined in section 9.1.2 of these Guidelines. If the block being returned is over 10% contaminated the PA shall seek a new block holder. If question c and/or d have a response of No, the request for return shall be denied.
