ORDER

On November 3, 2011, Kentucky Utilities Company and Louisville Gas and Electric Company (collectively "the Companies") filed a joint motion to deviate, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 14, from the requirement in the Commission's June 28, 2011 Order that the Companies file 15 complete copies of all documents in these proceedings. The Companies ask to be excused from filing any paper copies of portions of a workpaper attachment to their responses to Commission Staff's Third Request for Information, and to be permitted to file only one paper original per utility of the remaining portion of the attachment at issue as the attachment is voluminous.

In support of their joint motion, the Companies state that their responses to Commission Staff's Third Request for Information contain an attachment consisting of exhibits and workpapers that include a number of spreadsheets and Strategist modeling input and output files. The Companies further state that the Strategist files would be mostly unintelligible because they are intended to be read by computers. The Companies request permission to provide on compact discs the Commission's 15 copies of the work-paper attachment for each utility, and one original paper copy of each exhibit per utility of the non-Strategist workpapers and an electronic version of the Strategist workpapers. The Companies further request permission to serve the other parties to the proceeding with copies of the data responses on compact discs.

Having reviewed the joint motion and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that the responses to the aforementioned request for information are sufficiently voluminous to grant the Companies' request to substitute electronic copies for the 15 paper copies to be filed with the Commission and the one paper copy served on each party. The Companies should be allowed to file only one paper original per utility of the remaining portion of each exhibit at issue as the exhibits are voluminous.

The Companies should file their electronic copies with the Commission in a manner that is a mirror identical pdf version to any paper original that is submitted to the Commission so that, if the paper version contains separate volumes, the compact disc pdf copy should be scanned in a manner that mirrors the paper volumes.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The Companies' joint motion to deviate from the filing requirements of the June 28, 2011 Order is granted and they are authorized to file in electronic format with the Commission and serve on the parties those portions of exhibits as discussed in the findings above.
