Free Web Conference Helps Family Caregivers Address Legal Issues that Impact Seniors

The non-profit National Private Duty Association (NPDA) has announced that it will host a consumer education web conference entitled Addressing Legal Issues that Impact Seniors on Sept. 22, 2011, at 8 p.m. EST (7 p.m. CT). The live and interactive program will provide advice on elder law matters, including pinpointing when you need to address legal issues, what the implications are, and how to ensure that you and your family are protected. 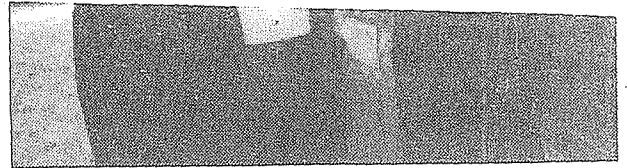

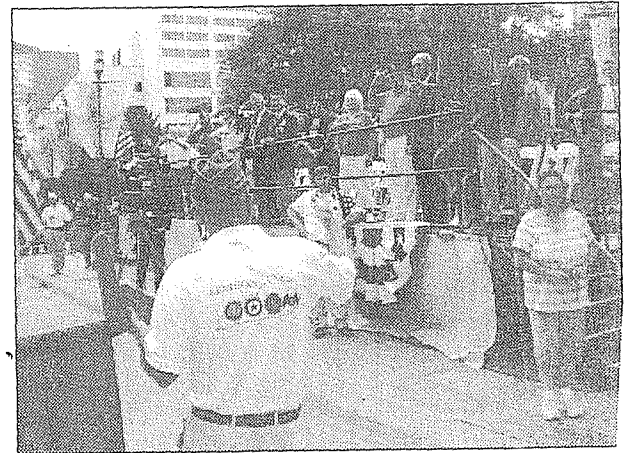

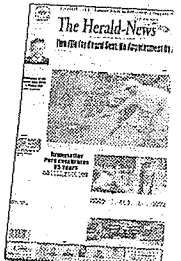
