During the time that the record was open in this matter, the Kentucky Public Service Commission (PSC) encouraged public comment from residents of the affected area.

Public comment forms were made available online and also distributed in conjunction with presentations by PSC staff as follows (attendance figures for public meetings exclude news media and industry representatives):

1. October 10 – Elizabethtown – Hardin County-Elizabethtown Chamber of Commerce
2. October 17 – Hopkinsville – Public meeting (3 people attending)

Although public meetings were poorly attended, presentations to business and civic organizations generally attracted larger audiences. In addition, participation in the west Kentucky Trade Expo enabled PSC staff to interact with several hundred attendees. Because the meetings were informational in nature, no sign-in sheets were kept.

Because the public comment forms were different in format, although identical in content, it was possible to distinguish between forms distributed at events and those submitted or obtained online.

A total of 203 public comment forms were returned. The majority – 148 – were from people who, either directly or indirectly, received a form distributed at a PSC presentation. Fifty-five (55) forms were submitted online.

Overall, 168 of 203 respondents (82.8 percent) favored an overlay, while 37 (18.2 percent), favored a split. Support for an overlay was weaker among those who responded online – 32 of 53, or 60.4 percent. Those returning the form distributed by PSC staff favored the overlay by a margin of 134 to 14, or 94.6 percent.

The principal reasons cited for favoring an overlay were a desire to retain the current phone number (64 respondents gave this as their top reason) and the potential cost to businesses if an area code requires them to change letterheads, brochures, etc (53 respondents cited this as their top reason).

Among those who favored a split, the most common primary reason for doing so was opposition to the 10-digit dialing required with an overlay and the difficulties it might pose for certain customers, especially the elderly. This was cited by 14 of the respondents favoring a split. Eleven respondents cited the confusion caused by two area codes in the same geographic footprint as the main reason for favoring a split.

A number of respondents provided reasons that were inconsistent with their position in favor of a split or overlay. For example, six respondents who favored a split said their main reason for doing so was because they wished to retain their current number. Similarly, two respondents who favored an overlay said it would be too confusing to have two area code numbers in the same area.

Of those who favored the overlay option, 10 self-identified as businesses or business owners. One self-identified as a local elected official. One person favoring a split self-identified as a business owner.

A more detailed summary of the top reasons cited follows.

While the majority of additional comments received on the forms reinforced or explained indicated choices, a number of respondents provided other reasons or suggestions in support of their favored option. These included:

- Two respondents suggested that area codes be changed so that all landlines would remain in area code 270, while only wireless phones would be assigned the new area code.
- One respondent stated that an overlay is preferred because of the burden a split would pose on elderly residents who would have to notify all of their contacts, particularly health care providers, of a new phone number.
- One respondent stated that an overlay would be preferred because businesses would have to notify existing customers of a number change in the event of a split and would not be reachable by potential new customers who had only the previous number on business cards, brochures or other literature.


