In 1996, the Reiddand Water & Sewer District was accountable to the Kentucky Public Service Commission. This meant that a "public hearing" was required concerning the building of the new Reiddand Sewer Plant and new sewer rates related to the project. I and one other customer attended this meeting. It was only after the District advertised for bids for the access road across our property ~~to~~ ^{to} the new sewer plant and the installation of sewers for our already approved subdivision that ^{when} Ronnie Freeman started a 1200+ signature petition. This petition ended up delaying construction for one year costing customers with a higher interest rate on the loan. Maybe he didn't like subdivision competition for his brother. In any case he moved out of Reiddand leaving the cost for the rest of us and ^{him} on a septic tank.

After being unsuccessful at getting the proposed location of the new sewer plant moved and the District approached me about an access road, I guess me donating land for the access road and reimbursing the District for (sewer) & (curb & gutter) installation wasn't good enough to stop the false rumors.
