ORDER

On April 30, 2012, Grayson County Water District (“Grayson District”) applied to the Commission for approval to execute an agreement with Kentucky Rural Water Finance Corporation (“KRWFC”) to borrow approximately \$3,700,000 to refund certain outstanding revenue bonds.¹

Having considered the record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that:

1. Grayson District proposes to execute an Assistance Agreement with KRWFC to borrow \$3,700,000, subject to an adjustment of up to 10 percent. The proposed loan will have a 27-year term with interest rates that vary from 2.35 percent to 4.35 percent per annum.²

2. Grayson District proposes to use the loan proceeds to refund the outstanding revenue bonds designated as Grayson County Water District Water System Revenue Bonds, Series 1995 ("1995 Bonds"); Grayson County Water District Water System Revenue Bonds, Series 1997 ("1997 Bonds"); and Grayson County Water District Water System Revenue Bonds, Series 1999 ("1999 Bonds").

3. Approximately \$1,524,000 of the 1995 Bonds remain outstanding.³ These bonds bear interest at a rate of 4.5 percent per annum and are held by Rural Development.⁴

4. Approximately \$1,205,000 of the 1997 Bonds remain outstanding.⁵ These bonds bear interest at a rate of 4.5 percent per annum and are held by Rural Development.

5. Approximately \$858,000 of the 1999 Bonds remain outstanding.⁶ These bonds bear interest at a rate of 4.5 percent per annum and are held by Rural Development.

6. Grayson District will expend \$3,767,266 to refund the outstanding bonds and to pay bond issuance costs.⁷

7. Grayson District estimates that its proposed refinancing will result in total gross savings and net present value savings of \$144,449 and \$105,812, respectively.⁸

8. Grayson District's proposed loan is for a lawful object within its corporate purpose, is reasonably necessary and appropriate for and consistent with the proper performance of its service to the public, will not impair Grayson District's ability to perform that service, and is reasonably necessary and appropriate for such purpose.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Grayson District is authorized to execute the Assistance Agreement with KRWFC to borrow no more than \$4,070,000⁹ for the purpose of refunding the outstanding indebtedness, but only under such terms and conditions as will produce both positive gross savings and net present value savings.

2. If the actual terms and conditions of the Assistance Agreement with KRWFC differ from those set forth in its Application, Grayson District shall, within 30 days of executing the Agreement, file with the Commission amortization schedules and work papers showing the actual gross savings and net present value savings that will result from the refinancing.

3. Within 30 days of executing the Assistance Agreement, Grayson District shall file a written statement with the Commission setting forth the date on which the Agreement was entered, the actual interest rates, and the principal amount.

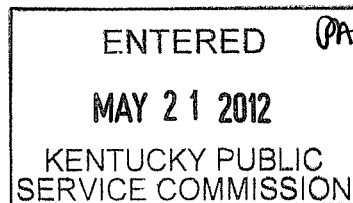

4. The proceeds from the transaction authorized herein shall be used only for the lawful purposes specified in Grayson District's Application.


5. Any documents filed pursuant to ordering paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Order shall reference the number of this case and shall be retained in the utility's general correspondence file.
