Re: Application of Duke Energy Kentucky, Inc. the Annual Cost Recovery Filing for Demand Side Management, Case No. 2012-00495

Dear Mr. Derouen:

On March 21, 2013, an informal conference was held in the above referenced case. The Staff requested explanations as to the incremental participation level of the Smart Saver Custom Energy Efficiency Incentive Program as filed in Table 1, page 7, of the application. As such, Duke Energy Kentucky, Inc. (Duke Energy Kentucky) respectfully submits this explanation in response to that request.

Custom Incentive "participants" are not strictly defined as a certain object. They may be a building, a chiller, a process line or even a single lamp and are all unique. A "participant" is not a metric the Custom program tracks to determine how effective the program has been. Duke Energy Kentucky tracks the number of applications received, each of which can contain any number of participants, and kWh achieved. Participants are just an intermediary counting mechanism used for purposes of recording performance.

As a hypothetical comparison:

- Customer #1 might apply for a single industrial chiller project that saves 250,000 kWh. This would be 1 "participant."
- Customer #2 might apply for a lighting retrofit of 1,000 fixtures that save 250 kWh each. This would be 1,000 "participants" but is the same aggregate result as the chiller.

The 850 pilot "participants" from the status update filing (Case No. 2012-00495) happened to be LED lamps replacing halogen lamps. Each of them saves approximately 250 kWh each, based on the retail stores operating hours. The aggregate savings is a little over 212,000 kWh.
