Dear Members of the Public Service Commission, I am having a difficult time understanding how I should be responsible for paying for energy I do not use. I have read the annual reports from Big Rivers and Kenergy, who is my Electric coop,

and it seems as if they got used to getting a large sum of money for what they were doing, and spent outside themselves. I understand that closing a plant and letting go of non-essential workers may not cover all the losses the electric corporation will sustain, however common sense should prevail: "when you don't have it you can't spend it"! Add to that: "if people are not using it, why are you still making it, or buying it?"

My last statement should be the major consideration, not having the residential community foot the bill for the loss of industry.

This is my story:

My house was built with six inch exterior walls, metal framing, geothermal heating and cooling, insulation beyond what was reasonable, including roof space. I have LED lighting, and the two of us left in this house work full time, so we are not even home a good portion of the day. Our energy consumption remains the same each day, every year, for the last eleven years we have been in this house. Still, with the first rate increase we are paying at least \$1.40 MORE each day. We are on a fixed incomes, and live minimally and responsibly. We do not purchase what we cannot afford. Since residents are being encouraged to save and conserve energy use, that will add to even more loss to the electric company and rates will go even higher, especially if the company refuses to reduce operations and generation (or purchase) of electricity.

LESS is costing MORE! Please encourage the Electric Company to tighten its own belt before asking for residents to tighten theirs!

Thank you for reading this. I know your task is a challenging one, one wrought with difficult decisions. We implore you to consider making the corporations take on the responsibility of cutting costs, by cutting production, not keeping production and passing the costs to the residents. To Whom It May Concern:

I am a customer of "Kenergy", living in Princeton, KY. My account number is 7-437-88-007-02-9. This letter is in regard to the 2nd RATE INCREASE proposed in less than one year from now. I signed up with Kenergy's BUDGET PLAN in October of 2012 at which time they tallied up my expected usage would be \$118.00 per month for 11 months and the "Settle-Up" would be in the 12th month. The person I spoke with told me that historically the bill would be "0" dollars and that they would give me a credit for the difference due. Also, that the bill would be very low and definitely less than \$118.00. When the actual bill came, I owed \$153.64.

I called them and was told I used a lot more electricity than last year. Also that they had a regular rate increase in the Spring of the year (nothing to do with the alledged 20% increase) and that the new budget rate would be \$168.00 per month (a \$50.00 increase over the year before). All of this was a result of one "BIG INDUSTRIAL" user was backing out of Kenergy. This large user of energy power had asked them for a

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reduction in rate due to the cost involved in running their company. I was told that Kenergy refused their request because they anticipated the other large users would want the same deal and that was the reason for the 20% increase. Now, the other large user, Century Aluminum, in Sebree, KY. is also pulling out and Kenergy is raising their rates by 21.5% AGAIN.

As a retiree on a fixed income, I'm now having to pay \$168.00 per month to Kenergy which is difficult because other utilities have also raised their rates (LP gas, etc.).

If it is a "true 21.5% increase" of \$36.12, my new rate for 2014 will be \$204.12 (which is a 75% increase) over my 2013 rate of \$118.00.

I think this is very UNFAIR for their customers in Caldwell County. Many people, like myself, are retired and live on a fixed income. Why doesn't Kenergy pull out of the Big Rivers Corporation? We are paying for decisions based on nothing to do with our county. Wouldn't it have been better to give the two large companies a break on their electric bill instead of allowing them to pull out of their program? What am I supposed to do? I feel as though I'm being forced, along with others, to go live in a cave somewhere.
