We're already suffering due to the last increase and there are many customers that simply cannot afford more. We certainly can't. If rates are increased again, we'll find other ways to continue to reduce our electricity usage, which will gain the utility nothing. I for one am close to retirement and certainly would be willing to leave western Ky. if this type of thing continues.
