47.9720 ay 45 North , Kentucky sound which was heard at the time of every shock, always preceded thee shock for at least a second, originated in one point and went off in an opposite direction." He noted the shocks came from a little northward of east and proceeded to the westward, and the center of violence seemed to be about Island #14 near Fulton County, Kentucky.

Those aboard the keel boats saw the river banks cave in, sand bars giving away, great trees falling into the vortex with a great crashing. The ducks, geese and swans flew about in wild disorder driven from their accustomed roosting places. The earth hissed and roared.

Twenty-seven distinct shocks were counted before morning, a morning filled with a pall so heavy that the sun's rays could not pierce it.

Lakes appeared where

solidly built log homes tremble and the noise so great as to make everyone sleeping awaken and run from their house.

The largest of the lakes to come into being overnight was Reelfoot in Tennessee and Kentucky. It "was formed by sand, blown out of a chasm, damming the waters which spread over the territory forming the lake." Great trees sank and stood upright for many years. In some places the lake is as much as twenty feet deep. It is, in the main body, about fourteen miles long and about four and a half miles wide, with many indentations in a hundred mile coastline.

The major part of the lake belongs to Tennessee, yet the head lakes are in Fulton County, Kentucky.
