

have that (Saturday) at Missouri. But today he had it. I was really proud of him."

"I had to get that confidence back on defense, and everything else would turn out for itself just in the flow of the game," Cauley-Stein said.

"He was outstanding tonight," Kennedy said of Cauley-Stein. "He's most certainly a very capable player, and tonight his length was bothersome. Six blocks, and he finished everything around the basket. Even when we would come up with something of a loose ball, he was always there to get the loose ball. He did a great job finishing for contact."

Cauley-Stein's presence was particularly key in the second half when the Wildcats pulled away from a 35-34 halftime advantage.

Cauley-Stein had eight points, three rebounds and two blocks in the first half, and 10 points, eight rebounds and four blocked shots in the second.

"He really took over in the second half," said Kentucky guard Aaron Harrison of Cauley-Stein. "He's been in a little slump, but we all knew he would get out of it."

"It was incredible," UK sophomore forward Alex Poythress said of Cauley-Stein's play. "I was just so happy to see him out of his little funk."

Cauley-Stein's efforts were just one key in Kentucky's ability to slow down Ole Miss guards Henderson and Jarvis Summers—the Rebels' leading scorers.

Henderson finished with 16 points and Summers had 11 points, but together they were just 10 of 31 shooting from the field—Henderson 6 of 18 and Summers 4 of 13.

"I think that's a direct correlation with the length Kentucky has," Kennedy said of his stars' shooting. "We just couldn't get clean looks over the top, and we've never been very proficient at the rim."

The Rebels shot just 38.5 percent from the field on 25 of 65 from the field, and they shot just 10 free throws, hitting eight.

The Wildcats hit 26 of 51 from the field for 51 percent, and were 26 of 36 from the free throw line for 72.2 percent.

Aaron Harrison had 16 points and six rebounds for Kentucky; Julius Randle added 12 points and five rebounds, James Young and Poythress added 10 points each, and Andrew Harrison nine points and five assists to round out the leaders.

The Wildcats outrebounded the Rebels, 41-26.

An announced crowd of 22,168 turned out in the nasty weather to see the game.

The Wildcats play at Mississippi State Saturday at 1:30 and play at Auburn Feb. 12 at 8. Both those games will be televised on the SEC Network.

Kentucky returns home Feb. 15 to play Florida. ESPN's GameDay crew will be at Rupp for that 3 p.m. tip.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. (AP) — Michael Frazier II scored 14 points, highly touted freshman Charlie Walker had two crowd-pleasing dunks in his debut and No. 3 Florida beat Missouri 68-58 Tuesday night.

Scottie Wilbekin finished with a career-high 19 points for the Gators. He was 13 of 16 from the free throw line, most of them down the stretch. Patric Young chipped in 13 points and six rebounds for the Gators (20-2, 9-0 Southeastern Conference).

DURHAM, N.C. (AP) — Jabari Parker scored 21 points and Rasheed Sulaimon added 19 points for Duke (18-5, 7-3 Atlantic Coast Conference).

The Blue Devils shot nearly 51 percent, hit 12

3-pointers against one of the ACC's best perimeter defenses and used a big run at the end of the first half to roll to their eighth straight victory over their in-state rivals.

Devin Thomas had 14 points for the Demon Deacons (14-9, 4-6), who have lost three straight for the first time this season.

They had 19 turnovers — including five straight during Duke's decisive run.

IOWA CITY, Iowa (AP) — Aaron Craft had 17 points, six assists and six steals to help Ohio State to its third win in four games.

LaQuinton Ross added 13 points for the Buckeyes (18-5, 5-5 Big Ten), who moved back to .500 in the league after starting a surprising 2-4.

Mike Gesell had 16 points for Iowa (17-6, 6-4), which shot just 3 of 20 from 3-point range and lost its second straight at home. Hawkeyes stars Devyn Marble and Aaron White combined for just 18 points.

Iowa soundly defeated Ohio State in their first meeting, rallying from nine down to win 84-74 in Columbus.

training. He can become the oldest conditioner of a Derby winner should California Chrome win Saturday.

Picking a Derby horse is about much more than seeing an impressive runner two months prior to the race and watching him develop. You still have to size up the rest of the field.

For the second straight year I have done that, and simply can't find a horse I like better, or think is as fast and talented, as the one I became enamored with months earlier.

I like Derby horses that had a solid foundation as a 2-year-old. Orb made four starts at 2 (winning one), while California Chrome made seven starts last year (winning three).

I like Derby horses that have tactical speed, where the pace of the race won't necessarily define what they must do. Sure, California Chrome has speed, but he doesn't have to be on the lead, his last couple of races just set up that way.

Depending on how the Derby unfolds, Victor Espinoza can place California Chrome where he needs to, either on the lead or a bit off the pace. But he won't be far back. Derby winners almost always are within a few lengths of the lead when they turn for home.

It's tough to pick a Derby winner, obviously even tougher to do so two years in a row.

Make it California Chrome, Tapiture and Wicked Strong. I admit I'm not thrilled with

For the record, I was set a week ago to pick Wildcat Red second, but his workout this week was too slow for my liking.


Also for the record, I was not going to pick Hoppertunity in my top three, so his defection Thursday was not a decision in my selections.

some young pitchers. We lost our ace last year (to graduation). Our ace last year was phenomenal.

"Last year was our first season at DI. We were 11-41, but last year we had 10 to 12 games that were decided by one run. Every game was a hard-fought battle, and this year that's not the case."

Jarboe has been a primary starter throughout her career at Northern. She's started nearly every game this season and started over half the games the other three years, all in the outfield.

This year she's hitting .243, second on the team with one home run, and she was named the Gelco Athlete of the Week at NKU April 7.

As part of its move from NCAA Div. II to Div. I, Northern can't participate in post-season play for four years.

"When I signed I had no idea," Jarboe said about the move. "The rumors didn't start until the end of my freshman year. I liked being DI, I liked who we played, and I knew it was going to be a

tough transition.

"Every senior wants to play in a post-season game, but this year my last game has been decided since the beginning of the season."

The last time NKU was in the post-season was 2012, when the Norse won their regional and hosted the NCAA Division II Midwest Super Regional. Northern lost the super regional series to Saint Joseph's College, finishing the season at 38-21.

Jarboe suffered a knee injury a week before the Great Lakes Valley Conference tournament that year, tearing an ACL during a game against Belarmine, and missed the entire post-season.

If that sounds like a lot of adversity, it's not what Jarboe is taking away from her time at NKU.

"I do not regret at all my decision to go to Northern," she said. "I absolutely love it. It's been perfect for me."

Jarboe said it was sports first in high school, but that's changed in college.

"Softball was my life," she said about her time at FCHS, "and I'd leave class to go hit balls. When I got here coach really, really

emphasized the importance of academics, and we're required to do so many hours at the study table."

Jarboe will graduate a week from Sunday with a bachelor of social work degree with an emphasis in hospice care.

"It's incredibly rewarding to spend the last precious moments of someone's life with them," she said, "to help them with the transition, and their families. It's rewarding, and you hear amazing stories."

Jarboe was recently named the most outstanding Bachelor of Social Work Student and was one of two student-athletes to receive the career service award at NKU's athletic banquet.

The career service award is based upon academic excellence, service contribution, character and leadership.

Jarboe has been active in bringing "You Can Play" to NKU. The "You Can Play" Project is an organization that promotes inclusiveness of athletes regardless of their sexual orientation.

She's been on the Dean's List every semester and has a grade-point average over 3.8,

and she's been a member of NKU's choir for four years.

Jarboe plans to start work on a master's degree in January.

In August she's marrying Jeremy Gardner, a fellow FCHS graduate who's been a football player and wrestler at the University of the Cumberlands the past four years. Gardner and Jarboe are graduating the same day.

There are a lot of changes, and the first is this weekend with the end of her softball career.

"There are seven of us graduating," Jarboe said. "We're a really, really close group, and we've all been avoiding talking about it. We played a doubleheader yesterday (Wednesday) and beat Morehead. It was like 'OK, that's our last weekday game. We're not going to talk about it.'"

"It's definitely bitter-sweet. I have some great times in my life — marrying Jeremy, graduation — and these are some of the most exciting times of my life."

"But I'm so sad the sport I've given my life and body to is ending."
