PETITION OF CINCINNATI BELL TELEPHONE COMPANY LLC FOR REVIEW OF A DECISION OF THE POOLING ADMINISTRATOR

Cincinnati Bell Telephone Company LLC ("CBT") hereby requests that the Commission review and overturn a decision of the number Pooling Administrator ("PA") which denied a CBT application for numbering resources. On May 2, 2014, CBT filed an application with the PA for a thousands-block of numbers to meet a specific customer request that it was unable to satisfy with its existing numbering resources. The PA denied CBT's application on the grounds that CBT has not satisfied the utilization and months-to-exhaust ("MTE") criteria established by the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") and contained in the Thousands-Block Number (NXX-X) Pooling Administration Guidelines. Under the federal numbering rules, a state commission may overturn the PA's decision based on its determination that the carrier has demonstrated a verifiable need for the numbering resources and has exhausted all other available remedies. For the reasons set forth below, CBT submits that the Commission is justified in overturning the PA's decision and granting CBT's request for a new thousands-block.

In its Third Report and Order in the Numbering Resource Optimization proceeding, the FCC found that "a carrier should be able to get additional numbering resources when there is a verifiable need due to the carrier's inability to satisfy a specific customer request." It also clarified that states may grant requests by carriers in such circumstances, as long as the request is for a customer seeking contiguous blocks of numbers and not vanity numbers. Therefore, this Commission has the authority to overturn the PA's decisions under the appropriate circumstances.

In the immediate case, CBT has a request from UC Health seeking 500 contiguous numbers to be used for a new facility opening July 31, 2014 within the Boone rate center. As explained in the attached letter (see Attachment A), this new medical facility will house a variety of physicians' offices, labs and specialty departments. The customer indicates that it can use any blocks except the 8 and 9 thousands-blocks which would conflict with its dialing plan.

CBT has reviewed its numbering resources in the Boone rate center and verified that it does not have 500 contiguous numbers available to fulfill this customer's request. When CBT submitted its application to the PA for a thousands-block to meet the customer's needs, the request was denied because CBT's utilization of 71.9% is below the 75% utilization threshold and the MTE in this rate center exceeds the 6-month or less MTE criteria. As a result, CBT will be unable to serve this customer without a directive from this Commission for the PA to release the numbering resources required to meet the customer's needs. To assist in the Commission's review of this petition, a copy of CBT's application to the PA, which includes the MTE and Utilization Certification Worksheet with the Pooling Administration System's response, is attached (see Attachment B).

In sum, CBT has demonstrated a verifiable need for additional numbering resources based on its inability to satisfy a specific customer's needs and the absence of other available remedies. For this reason, CBT requests that the Commission overturn the PA's decision and direct the PA to grant CBT's application for numbering resources for UC Health. Because the new UC Health facility is scheduled to open on July 31, 2014, CBT requests that the Commission expedite consideration of this request so that the numbers can be activated in time for the opening.⁴

UC Health is in the process of completing a new 40,000 square foot medical facility at 58 Cavalier Blvd., Florence, KY 41042. The Facility will provide Primary Care Physicians, Orthopaedics, Dermatology, Neurology, Women's Care Center, Lab Draw site and Internal Medicine Sub Specialty departments. UC Health has requested a contiguous 500 number DID Range. Cincinnati Bell has advised that the only the following blocks are available:

Florence Exchanges: 859-282-3040 - 3079 (40); 859-282-4420 - 4439 (20); 859-372-4740 - 4769 (30), 859-372-5060 - 5039 (40), 859-372-5060 - 5099 (40), 859-372-7780 - 7799 (20) 859-647-4960 - 4999 (40), 859-817-3370 - 3399 (30) 859-817-5780 - 5799 (20) 859-962-5800 - 5899 (100)

None of the above ranges meet the 500 contiguous number criteria we require for this new facility.

The Federal Communications Commission ("FCC"), in its Third Report and Order in the Numbering Resource Optimization proceeding, found that 1. "a carrier should be able to get additional numbering resources when there is a verifiable need due to the carrier's inability to satisfy a specific customer request."2 It also clarified that states may grant requests by carriers in such circumstances, as long as the request is for a customer seeking contiguous blocks of numbers and not vanity number".

The Facility is due to go live on July 31 2014. We wish to expedite the facilitation of this process and the issuance of a new DID-range. Any Prefix will suffice with the exception of prefixes which contain an 8 or 9 in the first digit of the prefix. We request a new range be assigned to UC Health in the Florence KY area to effectively and efficiently serve our patients in Northern Kentucky.







Instructions for filling out each Section of the Part 1A form:

Section 1.1 Contact Information requires that Service Providers supply under "Block Applicant" the company name, company headquarters address, a contact within the company, an address where the contact person may be reached, in addition to the correct phone, fax, and e-mail address. The Pooling Administrator section also requires the Service Provider to fill in the Pooling Administrator's name, address, phone, fax and e-mail.

Section 1.2 Service Providers who need a thousands-block assignment or for an Location Routing Number (LRN) are required to fill in this section. If needed for an LRN, a CO Code Application needs to also be submitted to the PA. The Service Provider should supply the Numbering Plan Area (NPA); the Local Access Transport Area (LATA), which is a three-digit number that can be found in the TelcordiaTM LERGTM Routing Guide. The Operating Company Number (OCN) assigned to the service provider and the OCN its parent company. An OCN is a four-character alphanumeric assigned by TelcordiaTM Routing Administration (TRA). In addition, the number of thousands-blocks requested should be supplied. The Switch Identification as well as the city or wire center name, rate center, rate center sub zone, homing tandem and CLLI TM tandem of the facilities based provider xi. Explanations of these terms may be found in the footnotes.

Section 1.3 The date the Service Provider completes the application should be entered in this section, as well as the Effective Date of the requested thousands-block.

Section 1.4 Service Providers should indicate their type, e.g., local exchange carrier, competitive local exchange carrier, interexchange carrier, CMRS. The also indicate the primary type of business in which the numbering resource is to be used. Service Providers also may indicate their preference for a particular thousands-block, e.g., 321-9XXX, or indicate any thousands-blocks that may be undesirable, e.g., 321-6XXX.

Section 1.5 Service Providers indicate the type of request. Initial requests are for first applications for thousands-blocks in a rate center in which the applicant already has numbering resources, and provide the required evidence as ordered by the FCC.

The thousands-block applicant certifies veracity of this form by signing their name, and providing their title and date.

Section 1.6 Service Providers must indicate the updated/current information in regards to contaminated TNs on the block they are returning to the pool. Blocks with over 10% contamination (101 TNs or more) shall not be returned to the pool unless they meet criteria outlined in section 9.1.2 of these Guidelines. If the block being returned is over 10% contaminated the PA shall seek a new block holder. If question c

III A CO Code application will also need to be submitted to the PA.

Companies with no prior CO Code or Company Code assignments should contact NECA (800 524-1020) to be assigned a Company Code(s). Since multiple OCNs and/or Company Codes may be associated with a given company, companies with prior assignments should direct questions regarding appropriate OCN usage to (TRA) (732-699-6700).




