Nolin keeps electrical safety at the top of your mind by broadcasting important safety messages on local radio stations. We strive to provide our communities with safe, reliable, and affordable electricity and to serve as your trusted energy advisor, now and well into the future.

Our responsibility to employees

It is no accident that safety is a top priority at Nolin RECC. We are committed to a culture of safety that is part of our daily operations. In fact, Nolin is part of the Rural Electric Safety Achievement Program (RESAP) that follows specific guidelines and protocols for electrical safety that are considered leading practices. Our line techs are required to wear personal protective equipment at all times when on the job. This includes special fire-resistant clothing that will self-extinguish, limiting potential injuries from burns and sparks. Insulated and rubber gloves are worn to protect from electrical shock. Our safety team regularly discusses important safety issues pertaining to work within the building as well as out in the field.
