With such a mild January, I was excited about getting a break on my LG&E Bill. Of course LG&E is not going to let that happen. My bill was jacked up. On my bill they put a "Weather Normalization Adjustment" charge. What's that? According to its website, this charge "provides...the company with the revenue it needs to recoup fixed costs associated with meter reading, maintenance, postage and safety." Isn't that what my utility payments go for? Isn't that figured into the price of gas and electric? Of course it is. This is just one more way to stick it to us.

And it isn't like this is the only phantom charge on my bill. I get hit with a "service charge" for gas and another "service charge" for electric. Now, the only service I got from LG&E this month is the bill that they sent to my house. Yet I have to pay 2 service charges no matter how much gas I actually use. And then I still have to pay for the gas!

This is fraudulent. They get away with it because they have a monopoly. All this money goes to pay inflated salaries to a bunch of do-nothing executives who would rather come up with ways to skim and steal than actually provide value for the money we pay.

I don't mind having to pay for the gas I use. My gas is metered, so they can easily see how much I use. If they just charged me for metered usage, I could control my LG&E costs by setting the thermostat lower and putting on a sweater. But there are so many fixed costs and phantom charges in my bill that they soak me no matter what I do. This is wrong. Is there anything you can do to keep them from putting these phony charges on my bill?
