"I think the spending in this is reckless and irresponsible," said Rep. Thomas Massie, R-Ky., a conservative who is backed by the tea party.

Republicans supporting the package include defense hawks who say military readiness has been harmed by years of automatic budget cuts known as sequestration. The budget bill boosts defense spending by \$165 billion over two years.

Conservative angst about the growing deficit was valid, he said, "but you are not going to fix them by cutting our military or by failing to provide the equipment that our troops need."

On September 7, 2017, the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("PSC") accepted for filing Symsonia Water District's ("Symsonia") application requesting to increase its revenue from sewer service by \$40,397, or 43.6 percent. After performing a review of Symsonia's application and financial records, the PSC Staff recommended that Symsonia be granted an increase in sewer service revenues of \$41,308, or approximately 42.5 percent. Pursuant to the PSC's Order of October 10, 2017, in Case No. 2017-00371, Symsonia requested that the PSC approve the PSC Staff-recommended revenue requirement and that Symsonia be allowed to implement the revised rates as follows:

The amended sewer rates Symsonia requests would increase the monthly bill of a typical residential sewer customer using 4,000 gallons of water per month by \$15.03, from \$28.21 to \$43.24, or approximately 53.28 percent.

If the Commission does not receive any request for intervention or hearing in this matter by February 22, 2018, the Commission will proceed to render a decision in the matter.
