### Re: Belfry – Pond Creek Sewer Project Mountain Water District Final Engineering Report

Ladies and Gentlemen:

## I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Several residents of the Pond Creek area filed a complaint with the Public Service Commission requesting the District be required to extend sewer service to the area. A Joint Stipulation and Recommended Settlement was submitted by the District and the Complainants to PSC. The Settlement was approved and the case was dismissed without prejudice. The Settlement provides that the District will pursue development of a sewage treatment plant in the Belfry – Pond Creek area. Specific provisions of the Settlement can be found in **Exhibit A** (PSC Case No. 2013-00092).

The Mountain Water District now seeks to fund and construct a wastewater treatment plant and collection system in the Belfry – Pond Creek area of Pike County. The proposed membrane bioreactor (MBR) plant will be located at Pegs Branch. The plant will have an initial capacity of 300,000 GPD and an ultimate capacity of 400,000 GPD. The collection system will extend along U.S. 119 north and south of the plant to serve the greater Pond Creek area, including the Complainants of PSC Case No. 2013-00092. Some existing lines feeding into the Williamson, West Virginia WWTP will ultimately be redirected to the proposed plant.

## II. BIDDING

The project was divided into two contracts for bidding. This was done in an effort to make bidding more competitive. It was assumed that most plant contractors would not be interested in the collection system work and most pipeline contractors would not be interested in plant construction. Contract 1 consisted of the wastewater treatment plant. Contract 2 consisted of the collection system and WWTP water supply.

The District and Summit Engineering made efforts to attract as many bidders as possible. This was done by reaching out to contractors and by postponing the bid opening twice to allow more time to prepare bids. Bids were opened on September 17<sup>th</sup>, 2018 at 2:00 p.m. local time at the offices of Dan Stratton, Attorney for the above referenced project. Bid results and award recommendations are discussed below.

**Exhibit B-1** shows the bid amounts submitted by all bidders for Contract 1 – Wastewater Treatment Plant. Bids were submitted by H2O Construction and Montgomery Brothers Contracting. The bid submitted by Montgomery Brothers Contracting was rejected due to lack of wastewater plant

Mining Engineering Architecture Civil Engineering Surveying construction experience. Therefore, the only responsive bidder for Contract 1 is H2O Construction. The bid submitted by H2O Construction is \$2,080,986.00, or 109%, over the project profile estimate.

**Exhibit B-2** shows the bid amounts submitted by all bidders for Contract 2 – Wastewater Collection System. Bids were submitted by B.P. Pipeline, H2O Construction, and Norris Brothers Excavating. The low bidder for Contract 2 is B.P. Pipeline. The bid submitted by B.P. Pipeline is \$401,315.00, or 13%, under the project profile estimate.

Equipment being purchased separately by Mountain Water District includes: (1) the residential grinder pumps at an approximate cost of \$534,000.00 and (2) the OVIVO MBR system at a cost of \$1,066,830.00. The total construction cost of all contracts plus the cost of equipment is \$8,173,615.00.

## III. ANALYSIS

The project profile budget can be found on **Exhibit E**. The total project funding is \$8,428,846.00. The project construction budget is \$6,493,944.00. The low bids exceed the construction budget by \$1,679,671.00.

The District secured advice of legal counsel with regard to bringing bids within budget (Exhibit C). Exhibits D-1 and D-2 indicate items and quantities to be change ordered from the low bids for Contracts 1 and 2 respectively, as well as revised prices and base bid totals. The scope of the necessary deductive change orders was derived with input from Owner, Engineer, and Contractor. Contract 1 had only one responsive bidder who agreed with the reduced scope of work. Contract 2 quantities were reduced to bring it within budget. Revised quantities were checked for all bidders and bid results remained the same. Exhibit E summarizes the initial project budget, the as-bid budget, and the proposed award budget.

The proposed deductions do not negatively affect the function of the plant or collection system. The collection system will serve 182 new customers who have signed up, satisfying the requirement of 174 new customers found in the RD Letter of Intent to Meet Conditions dated March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2016. The collection system will provide service to all of the Complainants listed in the PSC Order from Case No. 2013-00092.

The proposed deductions lower the base bid total for Contract 1 submitted by H2O Construction to \$3,220,154.60 and lower the base bid total submitted for Contract 2 by B.P. Pipeline to \$2,089,515.00. The approximate cost of residential grinder pump units was reduced to \$344,000.00 by removing residences and businesses that had not signed up. This brings the revised construction cost including equipment to be purchased by the District to \$6,720,499.60. Adjusting the contingency to 5% of the proposed construction award amounts results in an additional deduction of \$230,458.52 from non-construction costs. The total project cost after deductions is therefore \$8,424,943.08, or \$3,902.92 under total project funding. The remaining \$3,902.92 will be added to the contingency fund, bringing it to \$269,386.40.

## **IV. RECOMMENDATION AND CLOSURE**

H2O Construction has an outstanding reputation and has completed several projects of similar or greater size and complexity for both Mountain Water District and Summit Engineering. These projects were completed in a satisfactory manner. B.P. Pipeline has completed numerous projects in Kentucky and Ohio. The previously completed project list supplied with their bid indicates they have significant experience in pipeline construction.

It is our recommendation that the District award Contract 1 to H2O Construction and Contract 2 to B.P. Pipeline with the proposed deductions applied to each contract as described herein. The District approved a resolution awarding both contracts as recommended at the October 31<sup>st</sup>, 2018 Board of Belfry – Pond Creek Sewer Project November 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2018

Commissioners meeting. The award is contingent upon certain conditions being met. The award resolution is attached as **Exhibit F**. Pending approval of the award by Rural Development, legal counsel will proceed with the PSC submittal. Time is of the essence; the last day to award within the 90 day bid hold period is Monday, December 17<sup>th</sup>, 2018.

Complainants and Defendant have jointly submitted to the Commission for our review and action a Joint Stipulation and Recommended Settlement. After careful review, we approve the Joint Stipulation and Recommended Settlement and dismiss this matter without prejudice.

Mountain Water District, a water district organized pursuant to KRS Chapter 74, owns and operates facilities that distribute water service to approximately 17,134 customers in Pike County, Kentucky,<sup>1</sup> and that provide sewer service to approximately 2,385 customers in Floyd and Pike counties, Kentucky.<sup>2</sup> It is a utility subject to

Commission jurisdiction<sup>3</sup> and with the statutory obligation to make reasonable extensions of service.<sup>4</sup>

On March 3, 2013, Complainants, who are residents of the Pond Creek area of Pike County, Kentucky, filed with the Commission a formal complaint against Mountain Water District in which they requested that the Commission require Mountain Water District to extend sewer service to the Pond Creek area.

On March 25, 2013, Mountain Water District submitted an Answer to the Complaint, in which it admitted that it did not currently provide sewer service to the Pond Creek area and affirmatively stated that it is unable to expand sewer service to that area without additional funding. It identified several courses of action that would enable it to provide service to the area in which Complainants reside, but stated that it lacked the funding to implement any of them at the present. Mountain Water District asserted that it had acted in a reasonable manner and requested that the Complaint be dismissed.

Upon receipt of Mountain District's Answer, the Commission established a procedural schedule in this matter that provided for discovery and for a hearing. Following completion of discovery but prior to the scheduled hearing, the parties submitted a Joint Stipulation and Recommended Settlement for the Commission's review and approval.

The Joint Stipulation and Recommended Settlement provides that Mountain

Water District will pursue development of a sewage treatment facility for the Belfry/Pond

Creek area. It specifically provides that:

- Mountain Water District will authorize Big Sandy Area Development District to become the project administrator for purposes of funding the Belfry I Pond Creek Waste Water Treatment Plant, but Mountain Water District will administer the actual construction of the project.
- An agreed funding model will serve as the framework for securing funds for the proposed project.
- A loan from Rural Development will be necessary to complete this project. The size of such loan will vary based on available grants that may be obtained for the project.
- Mountain Water District retains the right to approve any debt assumed for the project.
- If it is not economically feasible for Mountain Water District to assume the debt necessary to finance the project, the scope of the project may be reduced or modified.
- Mountain Water District will apply for the necessary Rural Development loans and grants to cover the remaining cost. Any Rural Development loan may be subject to terms and conditions outside the requirements of an ordinary loan transaction.
- If Mountain Water District's current application for a Community Development Block Grant for the Douglas Wastewater Plant at Shelby Valley is not approved, then Mountain Water District will make the Belfry/Pond Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant its first priority for a Community Development Block Grant in the next available funding cycle, assuming it qualifies for such grant and receives the prerequisite approval of the Pike County Fiscal Court.
- Mountain Water District's current construction options will not enable service to all of Complainants. The current wastewater treatment plant must be expanded to reach all Complainants. Mountain Water District's current plant must be expanded to provide service to all of the Complainants.

 The time table and funding for such future expansion is unknown at this time.

Having reviewed the Joint Stipulation and Recommended Settlement and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that is reasonable, does not violate statute or regulation, is consistent with Mountain Water District's legal obligations as a public utility, and should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The Joint Stipulation and Recommended Settlement is approved.

2. Mountain District shall take all actions required by Paragraph 6 of the Joint Stipulation and Recommended Settlement as if individually ordered by the Commission.

3. The Commission's approval of the Joint Stipulation and Recommended Settlement does not constitute a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct any facility or Commission authorization for Mountain District to issue any evidence of indebtedness.

4. The matter is dismissed without prejudice.
