

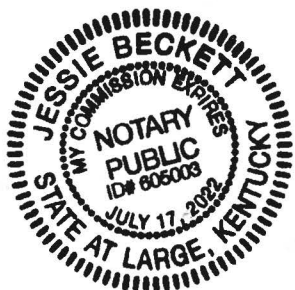

The fiscal court is to provide funding for stipends related to management and operations of county recreation programs to not exceed \$20,000 for 2019-20; provide use of county equipment when needed; reimburse the city for electric at athletic park; reimburse Pendleton County Water District for usage of water at athletic park; provide a partial salary for position of groundskeeper not to exceed \$4,600 for 2019-20; Provide \$20,000 for maintenance and projects at athletic park with fiscal court approval; provide 1/3 of any major maintenance or repair cost but must have fiscal court approval.

The Recreation Commission provides the recreation programs for the youth; makes payment for mowing services for the athletic part up to \$8,000 in 2019-20;

of the recreation programs on a mutually agreed upon schedule; partial salary for position of groundskeeper at athletic park not to exceed \$15,500; provide fuel and general maintenance costs of grounds keeping equipment at athletic park and 1/3 of any major maintenance or repair at athletic park but must have board approval.

The City of Falmouth provides funding of \$5,000

complex; 1/3 of any major maintenance or repair costs at athletic park but must have council approval.

The court approved the 2019 Ethics Inter-Local Cooperation Agreement and the County Clerks 2018 audit.

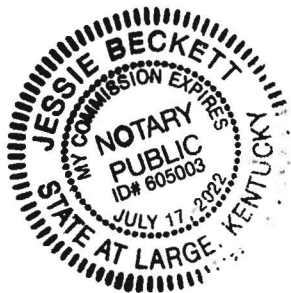
