

Excavation Damage: Facility could not be found or located

**Description of Incident** While shooting a mole underneath the road for a sewer drain, the excavator hit our 3" PE main line causing a 1" hole in the pipe wall.

Summary Information 4/25/2019

During an ongoing sewer line job, the construction company was boring under the main road to do a crossing. Their equipment hit a 3" PE main line of KFG's that was alongside the roadway, causing damage resulting in the release of gas. Upon responding to the scene, KFG field technicians shut down 3 valves to stop the gas from blowing until the construction crew could get to the scene and do the repairs. Repairs were made by EF and when the gas line was pressured back up, field technicians restored gas service to the affected customers or left door hangers if they were not home. KFG techs responded to an 811 for this area and informed the contractor that there were lines alongside the roadway but did not put down actual marks due to not being able to locate within the tolerance zone of 18 inches on each side.

**Full details such as the cause**

**Extent of the damage** Minor damage to the line, techs responded within 20 minutes so gas loss was minimal.

**Cost of the damage** \$300.00

**Steps taken to prevent re-occurrence** KFG and L&L Excavating have had an ongoing communication about the sewer project and have for the most part been able to avoid line breakage during this large job. KFG purchased this company after all of the lines were in the ground and they were not buried with tracer wire. It is an ongoing process finding lines and updating maps in our ARC GIS system.
