ORDER

This matter arises on the filing of an errata sheet to a supplemental post-hearing brief and opposition to that filing. On September 17, 2021, Mountain Association, Kentuckians for the Commonwealth, and Kentucky Solar Energy Society (collectively, Joint Intervenors) filed an exhibit to its supplemental post-hearing brief, noting that the exhibit was referenced on page 35 of the brief, and was inadvertently omitted from the filing. On September 20, 2021, Louisville Gas and Electric Company and Kentucky Utilities Company (jointly, LG&E/KU) filed an objection to the errata sheet filing, arguing

that they were denied due process because the errata sheet files new information into the case record after the case record was closed. On September 21, 2021, Joint Intervenors filed a reply to LG&E/KU's objection, arguing, among other things, that the errata sheet contained worksheets underlying the analyses contained in pages 29–35 of Joint Intervenors' supplemental post-hearing brief.

Having reviewed the errata sheet, LG&E/KU's response, Joint Intervenors' reply, and Joint Intervenors' supplemental post-hearing brief, and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that LG&E/KU's objection should be overruled and that Joint Intervenors' errata sheet should be included in the case record for the following reasons. The information contained in the errata sheet is the underlying support for the analysis contained in Joint Intervenors' supplemental response and the exhibit is referenced by name on page 35 of the brief. Thus, the errata sheet did not contain new evidence not already in the record. Further, LG&E/KU did not file an objection to the analysis contained in the supplemental post-hearing brief. Based on the above, the Commission concludes that the filing of the errata sheet corrects an inadvertent omission of an exhibit that provided underlying support for an analysis in the supplemental post-hearing brief and not new evidence of record.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that LG&E/KU's objection to filing Joint Intervenors' errata sheet into the record is overruled.
