ORDER

On June 20, 2023, U.S. 60 Water District of Shelby and Franklin Counties (U.S. 60 District) applied for approval to adjust its rates pursuant to the purchased water adjustment procedure set forth in KRS 278.015 and 807 KAR 5:068.

LEGAL STANDARD

In accordance with KRS 278.015, when a wholesale supplier selling water to a water district increases its rates, the water district has the authority to increase its rate commensurate with the wholesale supplier. The water district must file a copy of the notice from the wholesale supplier showing the increase in the wholesale rate, and a statement of the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rate adjustment. The Commission shall approve the filing by order after the above documents are filed.

DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

U.S. 60 District purchases water from Shelbyville Municipal Water and Sewer Commission (Shelbyville) and Frankfort Electric and Water Plant Board (Frankfort). Shelbyville notified U.S. 60 District that its wholesale rate would increase from \$2.35 per

1,000 gallons to \$2.41 per 1,000 gallons, effective July 19, 2023. Frankfort did not have any rate changes. U.S. 60 District proposes to increase the water rates to its customers effective July 19, 2023, to reflect the increased cost of purchased water from Shelbyville. Unaccounted-for Water

Commission regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 6(3), states that for ratemaking purposes a utility's unaccounted-for water loss shall not exceed 15 percent of the total water produced and purchased, excluding water consumed by a utility in its own operations. In its 2022 Annual Report filed with the Commission, U.S. 60 District reported a water loss of 12.0271 percent.² U.S. 60 District's application provides updated purchase and sales information for the period of June 2022 through May 2023. Based upon the updated information in the application and the percentage of other water consumed by the utility in its 2022 Annual Report, U.S. 60 District's unaccounted-for water loss is 10.0571 percent for the updated period.³ The cost of U.S. 60 District's total water loss is \$46,848.15.⁴

Financial Condition and Rates

Based on a review of Commission records, U.S. 60 District has not sought a general base rate adjustment since 2017.⁵ U.S. 60 District has regularly adjusted its rates through the filing of purchased water adjustment cases.

Based upon a review of the annual and audit reports filed with the Commission, U.S. 60 District's financial condition is acceptable and does not warrant the utility filing a general rate adjustment at this time because the utility's net income has remained stable since the 2018 rate increase.

Purchased Water Adjustment Factor

In its application, U.S. 60 District proposed a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.07 per 1,000 gallons. During the 12 months ended May 31, 2023, U.S. 60 District purchased 165,902,000 gallons of water from Shelbyville and 17,981,226 gallons of water from Frankfort and sold 149,687,700 gallons of water to its customers. The increase in the cost of purchased water from Shelbyville is \$9,954.12, resulting in a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.07 per 1,000 gallons. No rate changes occurred from Frankfort.

The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.07 per 1,000 gallons, as calculated in Appendix A and the rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are fair, just and reasonable and should be approved for water service rendered by U.S. 60 District on and after July 19, 2023, because the rates are supported by evidence of the increase in rates from U.S. 60 District's wholesale water supplier and the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rates in accordance with KRS 278, 015.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.07 per 1,000 gallons is approved.
 - 2. The rates proposed by U.S. 60 District are approved.
- 3. The rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are approved for water service rendered by U.S. 60 District on and after July 19, 2023.
- 4. Within 20 days of the date of service of this Order, U.S. 60 District shall file with the Commission, using the Commission's electronic Tariff Filing System, revised tariff sheets showing the rates approved herein.
 - 5. This case is closed and removed from the Commission's docket.
