## ORDER

On August 30, 2024, Atmos Energy Corporation (Atmos) filed an application requesting the extension of its Performance-Based Ratemaking (PBR) mechanism. As part of its application, Atmos included the utility's evaluation report. Additionally, Atmos referenced the annual reports it filed pursuant to the Commission's June 20, 2022 Order in Case No. 2020-00289, in which the Commission extended the Atmos PBR mechanism through May 31, 2025. Atmos's application proposes that the effective date of the extension be October 1, 2024, and extend until May 31, 2030.

Having reviewed the Atmos application and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds, that it needs additional time beyond October 1, 2024, to review the proposed extension. Therefore, pursuant to KRS 278.190(2), the Commission suspends the effective date of the proposed tariff for five months, up to and including March 1, 2025. As ordered in Case No. 2020-00289, Atmos's current PBR shall continue through May 31, 2025, until superseded by operation of law or otherwise ordered by the Commission.

The Commission directs Atmos to the Commission's July 22, 2021, Order in Case No. 2020-00085<sup>2</sup> in which the Commission mandated the use of electronic filing procedures listed in 807 KAR 5:001, Section 8. Consistent with the filing procedures set forth in Case No. 2020-00085, the Commission finds that electronic filing procedures should be used.

The Commission further finds that a procedural schedule should be established to review the reasonableness of the proposed tariff. The procedural schedule is attached as an Appendix to this Order.

Additionally, any hearing scheduled in this matter shall be held on the designated day or days and continued until called from the bench by the presiding officer. Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 2, if the hearing is not concluded on the designated day, the hearing may be continued upon verbal announcement by the presiding officer. A verbal announcement made by the presiding officer shall be proper notice of the continued hearing. Hearings are held in the Richard Raff Hearing Room at the offices of the Public Service Commission at 211 Sower Boulevard, Frankfort, Kentucky. Witnesses who sponsor schedules, testimony, or responses to requests for information are expected to participate in person at a hearing.

#### IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Atmos' proposed tariff is suspended for five months from October 1, 2024, up to and including March 1, 2025.

- 2. The procedural schedule set forth in the Appendix to this Order shall be followed.
- 3. Atmos shall respond to all requests for information propounded by Commission Staff, whether identified on the procedural schedule or otherwise, as provided in those requests.
- 4. Any party filing a paper with the Commission shall file an electronic copy in accordance with the electronic filing procedures set forth in 807 KAR 5:001, Section 8. Electronic documents shall be in portable document format (PDF), shall be searchable, and shall be appropriately bookmarked. The Commission directs the parties to the Commission's July 22, 2021 Order in Case No. 2020-00085<sup>3</sup> regarding filings with the Commission.
- 5. As set forth in 807 KAR 5:001, Section 4(11)(a), a person requesting permissive intervention in a Commission proceeding is required to demonstrate either (1) a special interest in the proceeding, which is not adequately represented in the case, or (2) that the person requesting permissive intervention is likely to present issues or develop facts that will assist the Commission in fully considering the matter without unduly complicating or disrupting the proceedings. Therefore, any person requesting to intervene in a Commission proceeding must state with specificity the person's special interest that is not otherwise adequately represented, or the issues and facts the person will present that will assist the Commission in fully considering the matter. A mere recitation of the quantity of utility service consumed by the movant or a general statement

regarding the potential impact of possible modification of rates will not be deemed sufficient to establish a special interest.

- 6. Any motion to intervene after the date established in the procedural schedule shall also show good cause for being untimely. If the untimely motion is granted, the movant shall accept and abide by the existing procedural schedule.
- 7. Atmos shall give notice of the hearing in accordance with the provisions set forth in 807 KAR 5:001, Section 9(2). In addition, the notice of the hearing shall include the following statements: "This hearing will be streamed live and may be viewed on the PSC website, psc.ky.gov" and "Public comments may be made at the beginning of the hearing. Those wishing to make oral public comments may do so by following the instructions listed on the PSC website, psc.ky.gov." At the time publication is requested, Atmos shall forward a duplicate of the notice and request to the Commission.
- 8. At any public hearing in this matter, neither opening statements nor summarization of direct testimonies shall be permitted.
- 9. Any hearing scheduled in this matter shall be held on the designated day or days and continued until called from the bench by the presiding officer. Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 2, if the hearing is not concluded on the designated day, the hearing shall be continued upon verbal announcement by the presiding officer. A verbal announcement made by the presiding officer shall be proper notice of the continued hearing.
- 10. Witnesses who sponsor schedules, testimony, or responses to requests for information shall participate in person at any hearing scheduled in this matter.

- 11. Pursuant to KRS 278.360 and 807 KAR 5:001, Section 9(9), a digital video recording shall be made of the hearing.
- 12. The Commission does not look favorably upon motions for continuance. Accordingly, motions for extensions of times with respect to the schedule herein shall be made in writing and will be granted only upon a showing of good cause.
- 13. The Commission does not look favorably upon motions to excuse witnesses from testifying at Commission hearings. Accordingly, motions to excuse a witness from testifying at a Commission hearing or from testifying in person at a Commission hearing shall be made in writing and will be granted only upon a showing of good cause.
