## INTRA-AGENCY MEMORANDUM

### KENTUCKY PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

**RE:** Informal Conference (IC) of Wednesday, May 28, 2025

The purpose of the IC was to discuss the data request issued on April 23, 2025, and provide Eastern Kentucky Power Cooperative, Inc. (EKPC) an opportunity to express concerns and request clarification before submitting a response. Intervenors present included the Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by and through the Office of Rate Intervention, and the Sierra Club.

During the conference, EKPC raised concerns that the requested modeling may overlap with a highly confidential project that is still underway. EKPC explained that complying with the request as written would require navigating existing Nondisclosure Agreements (NDAs) and could risk disclosure or misrepresentation of sensitive project elements. EKPC also noted that producing modeling data under these constraints would likely result in unrealistic outputs and impose substantial costs. Importantly, EKPC cautioned that disclosure or mischaracterization of confidential project information could jeopardize the viability of pending agreements and the project itself, which, if lost, could cause significant economic harm to Kentucky.

After discussion, the parties agreed to rework the hypothetical scenario in the data request to better align with EKPC's concerns and to ensure that the information provided in the context of EKPC's integrated resource plan will be meaningful to Commission staff. A revised due date for responses was tentatively set for mid-July.

There being no further discussion, the IC was then adjourned.
