To Whom It May Concern:

I have for many years maintained that the power company charges you what they want to, not what you actually use!

I offer two important proofs that this is the case.

The first is in the late seventies we lived in a four room house with a bathroom. We built a new twenty-two hundred square foot home in 1979 and moved in March, 1980.

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Our power bill was the same that we paid in that four room house with a bath.

I counted what we paid for the oil for our oil heater plus our power bill and it was relatively the same and we have two heat pumps here.

My second point is that in April, 2019, our power bill was \$287.98 on the budget plan. I only have my cancelled checks back to 2019. Our power bill this month was \$538.41 on the budget plan which means you pay the same thing year around. That's almost double. The point here is there is only my husband and me and we are only home half the time!

Anyone who knows will tell you that since 2016 we have left our home on Thursdays

and we come back on Saturday evenings. So, from Thursday mornings to Saturday evenings the house is empty. For years we kept our heat on 68 in the winter and our air on 75 in the summer, however, as we have gotten older we run the heat on 70 in the winter and air on 75 in the summers. And while we are away we adjust to save on electricity. We are gone three to four weeks each year to visit family.

I shudder to think how much our bill would be if we were home all the time, although I do not believe we are fairly monitored.

It is monstrous that this company is allowed to make the profit that has been reported that they've been making off

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the backs of ordinary citizens
who rake and scrape to get by.
I urge whoever makes this decision
to deny the raise they're trying
to make. Also, only allow them
to charge for what is used.
There should be no minimum.
