Comments:

The city of Jackson has many buildings, facilities, and utilities that rely on electric power to function. Our current budget does allow for a 14.62% increase on all of our power bills. This increase would be an undue hardship that would need to be passed on to our customers and tax payers in a time of economic instability. Many customers struggle to pay their current monthly bills, and often when we cut off services, customers go without the services because they cant afford to stay connected, and thats not safe or sanitary. Further, our water and sewer utilities had a 3% rate increase in July, and the city struggles to collect enough revenue to cover our expenses. The 14.62% increase by KY Power is excessive and will cause a ripple of additional expenses to households, businesses, and service providers that will likely be unbearable.

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
