#### ORDER

On November 18, 2025, Sharpsburg Water District (Sharpsburg District) applied for approval to adjust its rates pursuant to the purchased water adjustment procedure set forth in KRS 278.015 and 807 KAR 5:068.<sup>1</sup> On November 18, 2025, the Commission notified Sharpsburg District that its application was rejected for certain filing deficiencies. On November 20, 2025, Sharpsburg District submitted further documentation to correct the filing deficiencies, and the application was deemed filed as of November 20, 2025.

#### LEGAL STANDARD

In accordance with KRS 278.015, when a wholesale supplier selling water to a water district increases its rates, the water district has the authority to increase its rate commensurate with the wholesale supplier. The water district must file, within the statutory and regulatory deadlines, a copy of the notice from the wholesale supplier showing the increase in the wholesale rate, and a statement of the volume of purchased

water used to calculate the rate adjustment. The Commission shall approve the filing by order after the above documents are filed.

#### DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

Sharpsburg District purchases water from Bath County Water District (Bath District) and the city of Carlisle (Carlisle). Bath District notified Sharpsburg District that its wholesale rate would increase by \$0.39, or 6.84 percent, from \$5.70 per 1,000 gallons to \$6.09 per 1,000 gallons, effective December 15, 2025.<sup>2</sup> Sharpsburg District proposed to increase the water rates to its customers effective December 15, 2025, to reflect the increased cost of purchased water from Bath District. Carlisle proposed no changes to its water rates.

#### **Unaccounted-for Water Loss**

Commission regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 6(3), states that for ratemaking purposes a utility's unaccounted-for water loss shall not exceed 15 percent of the total water produced and purchased, excluding water consumed by a utility in its own operations. In its 2022 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Sharpsburg District reported a water loss of 16.2030 percent.<sup>3</sup> In its 2023 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Sharpsburg District reported a water loss of 20.8909 percent.<sup>4</sup> In its 2024 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Sharpsburg District reported a water loss of

16.6071 percent.<sup>5</sup> Sharpsburg District's three-year water loss average is 17.9003 percent.<sup>6</sup> The approximate annual cost of Sharpsburg District's water loss, based on a three-year average, is \$112,057.56.<sup>7</sup>

The Commission is placing greater emphasis on monitoring utilities that consistently exceed the 15 percent unaccounted-for water loss threshold. The Commission strongly encourages Sharpsburg District to pursue reasonable actions to reduce its unaccounted-for water loss. Failure by Sharpsburg District to make significant progress towards reducing unaccounted-for water loss may cause the Commission to pursue additional action with the utility.

#### Financial Condition and Rates

In Case No. 2019-00041, the Commission discussed the problems that can occur when utilities intentionally avoid a review of their financial records by relying solely on financing cases to increase rates.<sup>8</sup> A key recommendation from that proceeding was that water districts should monitor the sufficiency of their base rates closely and, in general, apply for base rate adjustments on a more frequent basis.<sup>9</sup> Based on a review of Commission records, Sharpsburg District last sought an alternative rate adjustment in

2022,<sup>10</sup> in Case No. 2022-00348, which became final on May 15, 2023, and reflected a required revenue increase of \$159,111 or 17.64 percent.<sup>11</sup>

Based upon a review of the annual and audit reports filled with the Commission, Sharpsburg District's rate-based income, or adjusted net income minus principal payments, was negative all five years but improved in 2023 and 2024 as a result of the approved rate increase. Cash basis income, or rate-based income plus depreciation, was negative in 2021 and positive all other years. A chart summarizing cash basis and rate-based income is presented below.

Given this information, the Commission recommends that Sharpsburg District monitor its operating performance annually and consider filling future rate cases no less than every three to five years depending on operating performance to ensure that its revenue is sufficient to support adequate and reliable service.

#### Purchased Water Adjustment Factor

In its application, Sharpsburg District proposed a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.39 per 1,000 gallons. During the 12 months ended September 30, 2025, Sharpsburg District purchased 102,793,000 gallons of water from Bath District and 28,100,100 gallons of water from Carlisle and sold 103,002,900 gallons of water to its customers. The increase in the cost of purchased water from Bath District is \$40,089.27, resulting in a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.39 per 1,000 gallons. No rate changes occurred from Carlisle.

The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.39 per 1,000 gallons, as calculated in Appendix A and the rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are fair, just and reasonable and should be approved for water service rendered by Sharpsburg District on and after December 15, 2025, because the rates are supported by evidence of the increase in rates from Sharpsburg District's wholesale water supplier and the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rates in accordance with KRS 278.015.

#### IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.39 per 1,000 gallons is approved.
  - 2. The rates proposed by Sharpsburg District are approved.

3. The rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are approved for water service rendered by Sharpsburg District on and after December 15, 2025.

4. Within 20 days of the date of service of this Order, Sharpsburg District shall file with the Commission, using the Commission's electronic Tariff Filing System, revised tariff sheets showing the rates approved herein.

5. This case is closed and removed from the Commission's docket.
