ENERGY EFFICIENCY AND CONSERVATION RIDER REPORT OF COLUMBIA GAS OF KENTUCKY, INC.

On September 14, 2009, the parties to this case filed a Stipulation and Recommendation ("Stipulation"). By Order dated October 26, 2009 the Commission approved the Stipulation. Paragraph 4 of the Stipulation stated, in pertinent part,

Columbia agrees to establish a DSM Collaborative in January 2010 in order to develop a second-phase DSM program, including DSM measures targeted for low-income customers. Columbia will file with the Commission a second-phase DSM proposal and corresponding Energy Efficiency and Conservation Rider adjustment proposal by August 2, 2010. All parties to this case will be invited to participate in the DSM Collaborative.

Columbia established the Demand Side Management ("DSM") Collaborative as agreed, and on August 2, 2010 submitted its Report to the Commission pursuant to the October 26, 2009 Order. As reported, the consensus of the DSM Collaborative was that additional time was needed to fully implement the Low-Income Furnace Replacement program and the other new DSM programs and until the programs are fully implemented, with some additional time for analysis, it would be premature to now propose modifications or additional phases to the DSM programs. Thus, Columbia has proposed no changes to the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Rider.

As of, October 27, 2010, Columbia's Low-Income Furnace Replacement program, Home Energy Audit program, and High Efficiency Appliance Rebate program were fully implemented

and operational as Columbia's WarmWise Energy Saving Solutions. Pursuant to Sheet 51d of Columbia's tariff, the Energy Efficiency/Conservation Program has an October year-end and the Energy Efficiency/Conversation Program Recovery Component shall be updated annually becoming effective with meter readings beginning with Company's February Unit 1 bills. Columbia's report of the Energy Efficiency/Conservation Program Balancing Adjustment for the period ending October 31, 2010 is attached hereto, but due to the timing of full implementation near the end of the reporting period, and thus very limited amount to report, there is no change to the recovery component from that authorized by the Commission in its previous Order.
