

MOTION TO AMEND ORDER

This Motion of the Henderson County Water District ("Applicant"), by Counsel, respectfully shows:

- 1. That on August 23, 2012, the Commission issued its Order in **Case No. 2012-00352** granting the Applicant a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct a waterworks improvement project and approving the plan of financing and the issuance of securities pursuant to KRS 278.023.
- 2. That the Project consists of Contracts A and B which involved the replacement of the water main along US 60 East, and Contract C which involved the replacement of an existing pump station located on US 60 West. Contracts A and B had significant quantity cost overruns including (i) additional road bores required by Henderson County; (ii) rerouting of the water main due to a gas line crossing; and (iii) the replacement of existing service lines. In order to complete Contract C, the Applicant needed additional funds.
- 3. That the U. S. Department of Agriculture, acting through Rural Development ("RD") has agreed to provide Applicant with an additional loan in the principal amount of \$300,000 to cover the Project shortfall. The additional loan shall mature over 40 years and shall bear interest at a rate not to exceed 3.50% per annum. RD has issued Amendment No. 1, dated August 8, 2013 to the original Letter of Conditions, which Amendment sets forth the new Project budget and raises the approved RD loan amount by \$300,000. The Amendment also requires the Applicant to provide a local cash contribution of \$33,345. A copy of Amendment No. 1 is filed with this Motion.

4. That Amendment No. 1 also contains minimum water rates required to be in effect prior to the closing of the RD loans. Applicant is not requesting the Commission to approve these rates as Applicant currently has an Application for an alternative rate filing pending before the Commission (Case No. 2013-00154).

WHEREFORE, Applicant, the Henderson County Water District, by Counsel, asks that the Kentucky Public Service Commission amend its Order issued on August 23, 2012 to approve the amended plan of financing and authorize the issuance of an additional \$300,000 loan to the District from RD.

Re: Letter of Conditions Dated December 16, 2010

Dear Mr. Spainhoward:

This letter shall serve as Amendment No. 1 to the Letter of Conditions dated Decenber 16, 2010. The purpose of this amendment is to revise project costs to account for additional materials and unforeseen construction issues, as well as to account for several non-construction items that exceeded budgetary amounts. Overall, the total project cost has increased by \$300,000 and this amendment will provide for the additional \$300,000 RUS loan to pay for these increased expenses.

The Second Paragraph on Page 1 is revised to read as follows:

"This letter is not to be considered as loan and/or grant approval or as a representation as to the availability of funds. The docket may be completed on the basis of a RUS loan not to exceed \$1,995,000 and an local (county) cash contribution of \$33,345."

Paragraph numbered "5" is revised to read as follows:

5. Reserve Accounts:

Reserves must be properly budgeted to maintain the financial viability of any operation. Reserves are important to fund unanticipated emergency maintenance, pay for repairs, and assist with debt service should the need arise.

The District will be required to deposit \$825 per month into a "Funded Debt Reserve Account" until the account reaches \$99,000. The deposits are to be resumed any time the account falls below the 99,000.

The required monthly deposits to the Reserve Account and required Reserve Account levels are in addition to the requirements of the District's prior bond ordinances.

The monthly deposits to the Reserve Account are required to commence with the first month of the first full fiscal year after the facility becomes operational.

The District also needs to fund an account for short-lived assets by depositing a sum of \$1,090 monthly into the account. The funds in the short-lived asset account may be used by the Distric as needed to replace or add short-lived assets in the District's water system. "

Paragraph numbered "12" is revised to read as follows:

" 12. Insurance and Bonding:

The following insurance and bonding will be required:

C. Fidelity Bond – The 99,000 will provide Fidelity Bond Coverage for all persons who have access to funds. Coverage may be provided either for all individual positions or persons, or through "blanket" coverage providing protection for all appropriate employees and/or officials. The amount of coverage required for all RUS loans is \$99,000.

Paragraph numbered "23" is revised to read as follows:
