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Within 60 days of the date of this Order, the Joint Utilities shall certify to the Commission that they have developed internal cybersecurity procedures.

Response

In March 2010, South Kentucky instituted a Cyber Security Plan. However, more recently, the Cooperative has instituted a Cyber Security Committee composed of several department heads within the Cooperative. The Committee has worked to develop and recommended updated policies for internal cybersecurity procedures. These developed policies are currently under review by management and a policy has been put forth to the Board of Directors for their consideration and approval at their June 30, 2016 meeting. The initial consideration and approval was scheduled to be accomplished on June 9, 2016; however, due to a scheduling conflict with our Annual Meeting, this consideration and approval had to be delayed until June 30, 2016. Upon their approval, implementation will begin immediately.

Customer Education

South Kentucky completed a very successful implementation of an AMI system in 2012. Since South Kentucky is a Cooperative we don't view our rate payers as customers, but as member owners. With this perspective in mind, the procedures used in offering any new program to the members generally are to:

- Thoroughly educate our employees about the program
- Promote the program using our monthly publication of Kentucky Living magazine
- Frequent press releases
- Utilizing our digital communications through our website, email, Facebook and Twitter
- Utility bill inserts
- Presentations to various community service organizations and leadership groups in our communities

This approach may be customized to meet whatever feedback we receive during the roll out, implementation phase or during the life of the program. The platform used for communication can vary depending on the assessment of what is most helpful to our members.

<u>Item 10</u>

Within 60 days of the date of this Order, the jurisdictional electric utilities shall file with the Commission their internal procedures regarding Smart Grid investments.

Response

South Kentucky RECC applied for a Smart Grid Investment Grant from the U.S. Department of Energy in 2009. We were successful in obtaining a 50% match from the DOE to offset the cost of our advanced metering infrastructure (AMI). We chose ACLARA as our vendor for the system and we installed advanced solid state meters and modules that provide the ability to remotely read and program meters and report electrical outages and meter tampering.

The system consists of a two-way power line carrier communications network that supports the meters and AMI applications with real time communications capability. We also installed a meter data management system which consists of software that collect's and manages the member's electrical usage data. This information is then available to our members through the Internet.

The system also has the capability of performing automated connects/disconnects of residential electric accounts that are 200 amp or less in size. This allows South Kentucky to turn on and turn off rental accounts and isolated homes and cabins from the office without rolling a truck.

We also offer our members pre-paid metering that allows each members to pay for their electricity on a more frequent daily or weekly basis if they so choose. This lets the member avoid paying a security deposit and allows members that work part time and seasonally to pre-pay for their electric service.

The AMI system also gives South Kentucky the ability to control water heaters and air conditioners through the installation of load control monitors, this helps reduce peak electrical demand.

The Kentucky Public Service Commission (PSC) approved the purchase and installation of this system and we anticipate it to last for many years.

Any additional equipment needed to maintain and add new members to the AMI system such as meters, collars and load control devices will be addressed through our Rural Utility Service (RUS) Work Plan which is submitted on a four-year basis and is filed with the PSC for a Staff Opinion.

We feel our current AMI system is state of the art and will continue to perform at a high level for decades; however, if our system were to experience problems or a newer low cost more effective technology became cost justifiable, and we determined the need to upgrade to a new system we would seek the approval of the PSC prior to a complete AMI system change out.
