July 2, 2014 Status Report

In conformity with paragraph 12 of the Commission's October 10, 2013 Order¹, Kentucky Power Company submits its second status report regarding ecoPower's construction of the Biomass Facility, subject to the terms and conditions of the Biomass REPA, as amended:

1. On June 26, 2014, ecoPower confirmed there has been no further work at the site since, as reported in the January 3, 2014 first report, site work was suspended on October 24, 2013. ecoPower indicated that it does not anticipate any further construction during the pendency of the appeal by Kentucky Industrial Utility Customers, Inc. of the Commission's October 10, 2013 Order. ecoPower further indicated that resumption of construction work by

The Biomass REPA, as amended, that is the subject of the Order and appeal remains, amongst other items, subject to the Conditions Precedent set forth in Article 6 of the REPA. The parties have briefed the appeal; the oral argument is scheduled for August 19, 2014 at 10:00 a.m.

ecoPower is conditioned upon, amongst other items, ecoPower's Financial Closing as set forth in the Biomass REPA.

- 2. The construction schedule and resulting commercial operation date are subject to the resolution of the current appeal of the REPA, the requisite conditions precedent of the Biomass REPA being met, and the ongoing negotiations between Kentucky Power and ecoPower.
- 3. On June 26, 2014 ecoPower indicated that site grading, access roads, and foundation work will commence upon financial close of the project. ecoPower also reported that, subject to the conditions precedent of the REPA, a four to six month due diligence period will be required after a final order before financial close occurs. ecoPower stated that upon final notice to proceed to the Engineering, Procurement and Construction contractor, the work schedule calls for a thirty-two month construction and start-up period prior to commercial operation.
- 4. Representatives of ecoPower indicated that all construction permits necessary for the construction of the Biomass Facility are in place, and that the necessary operating permits, a Kentucky Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit for industrial wastewater discharge and the renewal of the Title V Air Permit, will both be secured at a later date.
- 5. On July 2, 2014 ecoPower informed Kentucky Power that PJM and ecoPower met in January to discuss the status of the System Impact Study release. ecoPower stated that it requested that PJM "not expedite" the release of the study and provided background related to the appeal by Kentucky Industrial Utility Customers, Inc. of the October 10, 2013

 Order. ecoPower also reported that after reviewing the impact of delay on others in the study

queue and determining that there would be little or no impact, PJM agreed to defer the release of the System Impact Study, with the understanding that PJM and ecoPower would meet by telephone in late July 2014 to determine the next steps in moving forward with the Interconnection Services Agreement.
