The designated materials shall not be placed in the public record or made available for public inspection for ten years, or until further Orders of this Commission. 3. Duke Kentucky shall inform the Commission if the designated materials become publicly available or no longer qualify for confidential treatment. 5. Duke Kentucky shall submit to the Commission a written response to the allegations 10/11/16 contained in the Staff Report within 20 days of the date of this Order. 2. Duke Kentucky shall appear on December 8, 2016, at 9:00 a.m., Eastern Standard Time, in Hearing Room 1 of the Commission's offices at 211 Sower Boulevard, Frankfort, Kentucky, for the purpose of presenting evidence concerning the alleged violations of KRS 278.042, the most recent edition of NESC, and the Duke Kentucky Safety Manual and showing cause why it should not be subject to the penalties prescribed in KRS 278.990(1) for these alleged violations. 3. The December 8, 2016 hearing shall be recorded by videotape only. 4. The Staff Report attached hereto as an Appendix to this Order is made a part of the record in this case. 5. At the scheduled hearing in this matter, Duke Kentucky shall also present evidence on the adequacy, safety, and reasonableness of its practices related to the construction, installation, and repair of electric facilities as they relate to the facts of this case and whether such practices require revision as related to this incident. 6.
