- (3) Bronston Association is authorized to enter into an agreement with RD to borrow \$462,000.
- (4) The proceeds from the loan agreement with RD shall be used only for the purposes specified in Bronston Association's application.
- (5) If surplus funds remain after the approved construction has been completed. Bronston Association may use such surplus to construct an additional plant facility if RD approved.
- (6) Bronston Association shall file a copy of the "as-built" drawings and a certified statement that construction has been completed within 60 days of the substantial completion.
- (7) The rates set out in the Appendix are approved for service rendered on and after the date of this Order.
- (8) Within 30 days of the date of this Order, Bronston Association shall file its revised tariffs.
