 (1) Bronston Association is granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity.
 (2) Bronston Association's proposed plan of financing is accepted.
 (3) Bronston Association is authorized to enter into an agreement with RD to borrow \$462,000.
 (4) The proceeds from the loan agreement with RD shall be used only for the purposes specified in Bronston Association's application.
 (5) If surplus funds remain after the approved construction has been completed, Bronston Association may use such surplus to construct an additional plant facility if RD approved.
 (6) Bronston Association shall file a copy of the "as-built" drawings and a certified statement that construction has been completed within 60 days of the substantial completion.
 (7) The rates set out in the Appendix are approved for service rendered on and after the date of this Order.
 (8) Within 30 days of the date of this Order, Bronston Association shall file its revised tariffs.
 (9) Bronston Association shall notify the Commission one week prior to the actual start of construction and at the 50 percent completion point.
