This change will be effective as of the date of this Order and Licking Valley RECC shall calculate and include any under-recovery in its first month FAC filing after service of this Order and subsequent filings should billing periods result in more than a one month discrepancy. 3. Final Order Entered: 1. The rates and charges proposed by Licking Valley RECC are denied. 2. The rates set forth in Appendix B to this Order are approved as fair, just, and reasonable rates for Licking Valley RECC, and these rates are approved for service rendered on and after the date of entry of this Order. 3. Licking Valley RECC is authorized to recover rate case expenses of \$64,728, amortized over a three-year period, resulting in an annual expense of \$21,576. 4. Within 60 days of the date of service of this Order, Licking Valley RECC shall refund to each customer all amounts collected from that customer in excess of the rates approved in this Order for service rendered on or after February 13, 2025, through the date of entry of this Order. 5. Licking Valley RECC shall pay interest on the refunded amounts at the average of the Three-Month Commercial Paper Rate as reported in the Federal

Reserve Bulletin and the Federal Reserve Statistical Release on the date of this Order. Refunds shall be based on each customer's usage while the proposed rates were in effect and shall be made as a one-time credit to the bills of current customers and by check to customers who have discontinued service since February 13, 2025. 6. Within 75 days of the date of this Order, Licking Valley RECC shall submit a written report to the Commission in which it describes its efforts to refund all monies collected in excess of the rates that are set forth in Appendix B to this Order.
