Appalachian Wireless shall file a copy of the final decision regarding its pending FAA and KAZC applications for the proposed construction within ten days of receiving the decision. 3. Appalachian Wireless shall immediately notify the Commission in writing if, after the antenna tower is built and utility service is commenced, the tower is not used for a period of three months in the manner authorized by this Order. 4.
